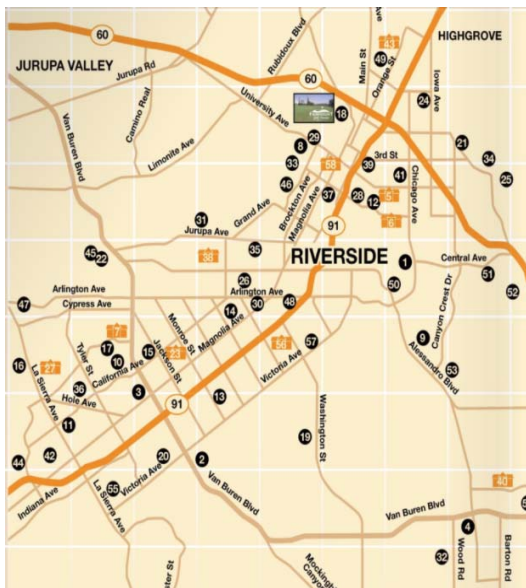




Castleview Arroyo Project

- 270 hours of organization and execution of the cleanup event

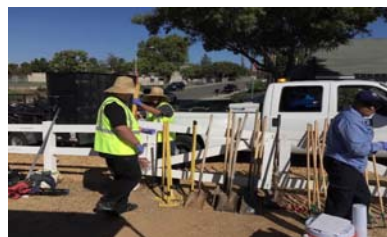


Community Strength: is RIVERSIDE PRIDE
