SUBJECT: AWARD BID NO. 7525 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE 2017/2018 SENATE

BILL-1 MAINTENANCE AND TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS TO EBS GENERAL

ENGINEERING, INC. IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,394,435.75

ISSUE:

Award a construction contract for Bid No. 7525 for the 2017/2018 Senate Bill-1 Maintenance and Traffic Improvements at various locations throughout the City to EBS General Engineering, Inc., of Corona, California, in the amount of \$2,394,435.75.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the City Council:

- 1. Award a construction contract for Bid No. 7525 for the 2017/2018 Senate Bill-1 Maintenance and Traffic Improvements to EBS General Engineering, Inc., of Corona, California, in the amount of \$2,394,435.75; and
- 2. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the construction contract with EBS General Engineering, Inc., including making minor non-substantial changes.

BACKGROUND:

On April 28, 2017, the California Governor signed Senate Bill 1, which is known as the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (SB-1), to address basic road maintenance, rehabilitation and critical safety needs on both the state highway and local street networks. SB-1 increases per gallon fuel excise taxes; increases diesel fuel sales taxes and vehicle registration fees; and provides for inflationary adjustments to tax rates in future years.

The California State Controller's Office deposits various portions of these revenues into the State's Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA). A percentage of the RMRA funds are apportioned by formula to eligible cities and counties pursuant to Streets and Highways Code Section 2032(h) as part the SB-1 Local Street and Roads Program (LSRP).

On October 3, 2017, the City Council authorized a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$1,834,563 of the 2017-2018 RMRA funds, and approved the 2017-2018 LSRP projects list.

DISCUSSION:

The 2017/2018 SB-1 Maintenance and Traffic Improvements project (Project) will provide the following work at various locations throughout the City (Attachment 1):

- Repave Box Springs Boulevard from Sycamore Canyon Boulevard to River Crest Drive, and Pierce Street from Magnolia Avenue to Indiana Avenue (0.81 miles);
- 2. Repave 3.26 miles of minor streets in 5 neighborhoods;
- 3. Construct new AC paving and decorative concrete sidewalk in the alley bounded by Franklin Avenue and Kansas Avenue, south of Fifth Street near Longfellow Middle School. This work includes collaboration with the Eastside Neighborhood residents for the construction of the sidewalk which will accommodate future installation of decorative mosaic artwork;
- 4. Construct a pedestrian concrete pad within the parkway adjacent to Longfellow Middle School for students drop-off and pickup;
- 5. Install a new High-Intensity Activated Crosswalk Beacon (HAWK) at Arlington Avenue east of Murray Street;
- 6. Install a new signal and reconfigure the crosswalk striping at the intersection of Mission Inn Avenue and Pine Street;
- 7. Reconstruct damaged concrete curbs, gutters, sidewalks, driveways, and pedestrian ramps; and
- 8. Install signing and striping.

On April 3rd, 2018, four bids were received for the construction of the Project (Attachment 2). The lowest responsive bid was EBS General Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$2,394,435.75, which is 5.71% over the Engineer's Estimate.

The Purchasing Manager concurs that the recommendation to award is in compliance with Purchasing Resolution 23256.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated total Project cost including design, construction, construction engineering, and contingencies is \$2,700,000 (Table 1).
