SPEED LIMIT ZONE - BRADLEY/JEFFERSON - ORDINANCE ADOPTED The City Council adopted an ordinance amending Section 10.76.010 of the Riverside Municipal Code designating the prima facie speed limits for streets and portions thereof in accordance with the provisions of Sections 10.20.020 and 10.020.030 revising the 35 mph speed limit zone boundaries on Bradley Street from "Washington Street to Eastgate Court" to "Washington Street to Harbart Drive," reducing the speed limit from 45 mph to 40 mph on Jefferson Street from Victoria Avenue to Bradley Street, and revising the 45 mph speed limit zone boundaries on Jefferson Street from "Evans Street to Bradley Street" to "Evans Street to Victoria Avenue"; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Ordinance No. 7418 of the City of Riverside, California Amending Section 10.76.010 of the Riverside Municipal Code Designating the Prima Facie Speed Limits for Streets and Portions Thereof in Accordance with the Provisions of Sections 10.20.020

# AGREEMENT - PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE SERVICES - TURBLEX VARIABLE VANE HIGH SPEED TURBINE TYPE BLOWERS - WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLANT
