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

AXLE RESTRICTIONS - ALESSANDRO/CENTRAL/CHICAGO/IOWA/ JURUPA - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED

The City Council introduced an ordinance establishing axle restrictions prohibiting use by commercial vehicles exceeding three axles on the following street segments: (1) Alessandro Boulevard from Central Avenue to Trautwein Road; (2) Arlington Avenue from Horace Street to Chicago Avenue; (3) Central Avenue from: (a) Fremont Street to Brockton Avenue; and (b) Alessandro Boulevard to State Route 91; (4) Chicago Avenue from Arlington Avenue to Central Avenue; (5) Iowa Avenue from Spruce Street to Blaine Street; and (6) Jurupa Avenue from Fremont Street to Brockton Avenue; whereupon, an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Section 10.56.050 of the Riverside Municipal Code to Establish Axle Restrictions on Segments of Alessandro Boulevard, Arlington, Central, Chicago, Iowa, and Jurupa Avenues," was presented and introduced.

5-FOOT WIDE GRANT OF EASEMENT - RIVERSIDE FOOD LAB PROJECT - 3605 MARKET

The City Council (1) approved a 5-foot-wide Grant of Easement from the City to Southern California Gas Company, for no financial consideration, to construct, maintain, operate, add to, or extend, one or more pipelines, together with metering, and other appurtenances for distribution of natural gas to City-owned 3605 Market Street, bearing Assessor Parcel Number 213-221-009, for the benefit of the Riverside Food Lab Project; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Grant of Easement, including making minor, non-substantive changes, and to sign all documents and instruments necessary to complete the transaction.

LEASE AGREEMENT - OFFICE AND HANGAR SPACE - RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT - 6951 FLIGHT

The City Council (1) approved a Lease Agreement with Martini Adamson Partnership, dba NextGen Flight Academy, Request for Proposals (RFP) 1752, for approximately 7,800 square feet of office and hangar space, for a five-year term with two five-year extension options at Riverside

LEASE AMENDMENT - VAN BUREN GOLF CENTER - 6720 VAN BUREN The City Council (1) approve the Tenth Amendment to Lease Agreement with Van Buren Golf Center, LLC., to increase the monthly rent by \$100 from \$1,000 to \$1,100, for estimated annual lease revenue of \$13,200 to the Airport Fund for a period of twelve (12) months ending May 31, 2019; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Tenth Amendment to Lease Agreement with Van Buren Golf Center, LLC, including making minor and non-substantive changes.
