

No Soliciting and/or Custom Signs – Installation at Select Freeway Exit Ramps

BACKGROUND

- 1. No Soliciting signs may be utilized by public agencies within California to prohibit soliciting and panhandling in accordance with:
 - a. California Streets and Highway Code; and
 - b. California Vehicle Code (CVC).
- 2. These signs serve as notification of the regulations at specific locations where such activities may be deemed a nuisance and/or unsafe.

CALIFORNIA STREETS AND HIGHWAY CODE

California Streets & Highway Code Section 225.5:

- 1. States no persons shall display, sell, offer for sale, or otherwise vend or attempt to vend any merchandise, footstuff, or service within any vista point or safety roadside rest area; and
- 2. Also specifies no person shall solicit money within any vista point or safety roadside rest for any purpose.

CALIFORNIA VEHICLE CODE (CVC)

CVC Section 22520.5:

- Prohibits solicitation, the display, sale, offering for sale, or vending of any merchandise or service while being wholly or partly within any of the following:
 - a. Right-of-way (ROW) of any freeway, including any on or off ramp, or roadway shoulder within the ROW;
 - b. Any roadway or adjacent shoulder within 500' of a freeway on or off ramp; and
 - c. Any sidewalk within 500' of a freeway on or off ramp when vending or attempting to vend to vehicular traffic.
- 2. First violation is an infraction, second a misdemeanor.

CALIFORNIA VEHICLE CODE (CVC) CONTINUED

CVC Section 22520.6:

- Prohibits any person from engaging in any activity within a highway roadside rest areas or vista point prohibited by rules and regulations adopted pursuant to Section 225 of the Streets and Highways Code; and
- 2. First violation is an infraction, second a misdemeanor.

EFFORTS BY OTHER LOCAL AGENCIES

- 1. City of Upland:
 - a. Collaborated with a local private group to develop an education campaign aimed at discouraging panhandling through the installation of "Say No to Panhandling" signs;
 - b. Obtained Caltrans encroachment permits and installed signs at select freeway exit ramps; and
 - c. Caltrans subsequently requested to change signs to standard No Soliciting S24(CA) signs which is currently in process.

- Frequently utilized at freeway ramps; and
- 3. Supported by Caltrans.

EFFORTS BY OTHER LOCAL AGENCIES (CONTINUED)

- 2. City of Redlands:
 - a. Adopted an ordinance prohibiting aggressive solicitation;
 - b. Restricts intentional physical contact with or the blocking or interfering with the safe and free passage of an occupied vehicle without consent in the course of soliciting, asking, or begging; and
 - Violations are punishable as misdemeanor or infraction at the discretion of the City Attorney; and
- 3. City of Menifee:
 - Adopted an ordinance prohibiting certain forms of solicitation including aggressive solicitations and at specific locations including in driveways, on median strips and freeway ramps, and from persons in vehicles;
 - b. Has 3 existing S24(CA) signs in place at select freeway exit ramps; and
 - c. Violators are guilty of a misdemeanor and may receive administrative citations.

CITY OF RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL CODE

- RMC Section 9.04.010 prohibits certain forms of aggressive solicitation;
- 2. Restricts solicitation from persons in vehicles, in driveways, and on median strips and freeway ramps;
- 3. Purpose to protect public health, safety, and general welfare of the people of Riverside; and
- 4. Violations are punishable as a misdemeanor or infraction, chargeable at the City Attorney's discretion.

BENEFITS OF NO SOLICITATION SIGNS

- Deter solicitation and panhandling activities at freeway exit ramps;
- 2. Facilitate enforcement of violations;
- 3. Discourage motorists from stopping and/or obstructing traffic to buy from vendors or give to panhandlers;
- 4. Create a less intimidating more enjoyable environment for residents and visitors; and
- 5. Enhance safety for pedestrians and motorists.

OPTION FOR CUSTOM EDUCATIONAL SIGNS

- Combined use of both No Solicitation and custom educational signs at freeway exit ramps may target both the panhandlers and the motorists who give and thereby contribute to such activities.
- 2. Though the custom educational signs are not enforceable they discourage giving to panhandlers and giving to legitimate local homeless facilities or charities.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Committee approve installation of:

- 1. Standard No Soliciting signs at designated SR-60, I-215, and SR-91 freeway exit ramps within the City to prohibit soliciting and panhandling and/or;
- 2. Custom educational signs at designated SR-60, I-215, and SR-91 freeway exit ramps within the City to discourage motorists from giving to panhandlers.
