# SUBJECT: DISCUSSION ON ESTABLISHING A NOMINATING COMMITTEE AS A PERMANENT STANDING COMMITTEE WITH YEAR-ROUND DUTIES

#### <u>ISSUE</u>

Discuss and recommend the establishment of a Nominating Committee as a permanent standing committee of the Metropolitan Museum Board with year-round duties.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

Approve the establishment of a Nominating Committee as a permanent standing committee of the Metropolitan Museum Board with year-round duties.

#### BACKGROUND

Nominating committees in museums of all sizes and governance structures are often: 1) established as standing committees; and 2) have an expanded charge that includes board education and engagement throughout the year. Nominating committees have a role in determining the strength and vigor of the cadre of volunteer leaders. An example of the duties typical of a year-round Nominating Committee might include:

- 1. Identify, cultivate, and recommend for Board membership individuals with the qualities necessary for effective leadership.
- 2. Oversee the planning and execution of new Board member orientation and recommend committee assignments based on strengths and interests.
- 3. Provide opportunities for Board members to improve understanding of their roles and of Museum operations through workshops and similar methods.
- 4. Nominate a slate of officers for Board approval that is focused on skilled leaders in cultural stewardship.
- 5. Supervise the Board rotation policy and ensure its proper implementation.
- 6. Carry out regular self-evaluations for the Board.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Museum is embarking upon a period of radical institutional change calling for a greater-thanusual level of community engagement. As an important conduit between community and City Council, the Board is uniquely positioned to improve this process through its own deepened engagement.
