SUBJECT: UPDATE ON THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE'S PARTICIPATION IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA PUBLIC POWER AUTHORITY

ISSUE:

Receive an update from Michael Webster, Executive Director of Southern California Public Power Authority, on the City of Riverside's participation in Southern California Public Power Authority.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board of Public Utilities receive this report.

BACKGROUND:

Formed in 1980, Southern California Public Power Authority (SCPPA) is a joint powers agency comprised of 11 municipal utilities and one irrigation district. SCPPA's members consist of the municipal utilities of Anaheim, Azusa, Banning, Burbank, Cerritos, Colton, Glendale, Los Angeles, Pasadena, Riverside, Vernon, and the Imperial Irrigation District.

The purpose of SCPPA's formation was to create a separate public entity (in this case a joint powers agency) to capture the economies-of-scale by working together to undertake the planning, financing, development, acquisition, construction, reconstruction, betterment, operating, and maintenance of electric generation and transmission facilities.

DISCUSSION:

Michael Webster, Executive Director of SCPPA, will present an update on the City's participation in joint projects and services and the value of SCPPA to its members.
