HIGHLIGHTS AND EMPLOYEE APPRECIATION IN RECOGNITION OF JULY

BEING PROCLAIMED "PARKS AND RECREATION" MONTH

ISSUE:

Receive a presentation on the programs, staff, and services of the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department that enhanced the customer experience and/or received recognition for excellence, innovation and meeting the objective that "Parks Make Life Better."

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Park and Recreation Commission receive a presentation on the programs, staff and services of the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department.

BACKGROUND:

On July 10, 2018, City Council adopted a proclamation in support of the National Recreation and Parks Association (NRPA) declaring July as "Park and Recreation" month. NRPA's "Parks and Recreation: A Lifetime of Discovery" campaign urges residents to explore everything that the Parks, Recreation, and Community Services Department (PRCSD) has to offer.

In recognition of the proclamation of July as Parks and Recreation Month, PRCSD is highlighting the array of programs and services to enhance the lives of the residents of Riverside. Staff prides themselves on providing high-quality services to the community with award-winning programs and activities for residents of all ages and interests in a variety of safe and attractive parks, landscapes, and facilities. PRCSD services include maintenance, park renovations, and construction projects; to special events, athletics, social services, cultural arts, school age programs and much more. The primary objective of PRCSD is to provide the community with resources, a safe place to relax, adequately maintained facilities, and opportunities for physical activity; and to have fun. With the collaboration of community groups, local businesses and non-profit organizations, staff and volunteers ensure that "Parks Make Life Better."

DISCUSSION:

Department Recognition

To be on the cutting edge of industry trends, the PRCSD is constantly looking for ways to enhance programs and services. Through the efforts of staff and their innovative ideas, the City of Riverside continues to be a model for the industry by providing innovative and exciting programs, activities and services. The PRCSD continues to maintain 50 developed and natural parks, with 13 community centers and 7 pools. The facilities all host an assortment of amenities for all ages and interests.

In March 2018, the PRCSD was recognized by the California Parks and Recreation Society (CPRS) and received four Awards of Excellence (the highest honor granted by CPRS) in the following categories: "Creating Community" – Project Bridge Program; "Marketing & Communications" – Capture Riverside Photo Contest & Explore Riverside Activity Guide; and "Champions of the Community" – Riverside Live Steamers. These programs and activities represent only a small segment of the audience served and the vast reach of the department within the City of Riverside.

In addition to providing programs and services that are high in demand, the PRCSD continues to look for ways to enhance the customer experience by providing excellent customer service and efficient methods for participation in City programs. Staff have also sought out partnerships and sponsorship opportunities to maintain and enhance service levels. The most valuable tool utilized by the PRCSD staff is customer feedback and suggestions. This year, through customer survey results and collaboration from numerous partner groups, various program modifications have been made to existing programs/services along with updates to the Department's business practices for maximum efficiency.
