### BACKGROUND

1. September 26, 2013 – Governor Brown signed legislation creating the Active Transportation Program (ATP).
2. May 16, 2018 – California Transportation Commission (CTC) announced ATP Cycle 4 Call for Projects.
  - a) Provides approximately \$440 million in federal and state grants over programming years 2019/20 to 2022/23.

## DISCUSSION

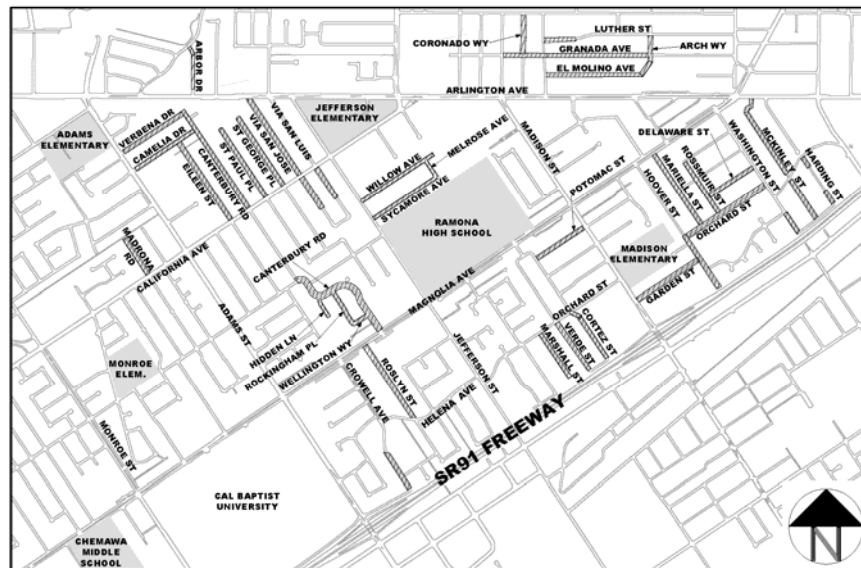
1. Since 2014, Public Works has secured \$6,561,217 in federal and state grants for five projects under ATP Cycles 1, 2, and 3;
2. If successful, the current grant of \$3,834,000 will allow the City to construct concrete sidewalks and pedestrian ramps in 37 local streets that do not currently have sidewalks;
3. City will provide \$1,000,000 local match funds (20.6%).
  - a) \$250,000 per year (City Gas Tax) over 4 years (2019/20 to 2022/23)

## RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

1. Authorize the submittal of a \$3,834,000 grant application to California Transportation Commission to construct pedestrian improvements in the Ramona and Magnolia Center neighborhoods; and
2. Upon grant award, authorize local matching funds in the total amount of \$1,000,000, or \$250,000 annually over a four year period beginning in FY 2019/20 from City Gas Tax revenues.
