BACKGROUND

- 1. Policies to preserve Victoria Avenue's historic agricultural character, the City's citrus heritage, and the greenbelt:
 - a. Proposition R
 - b. Measure C
 - c. General Plan 2025
- 2. Victoria Avenue In November of 2003, the City Council adopted Victoria Avenue Ad-Hoc Committee Recommendations.

BACKGROUND

- 3. 2003 City Council Action:
 - a. Recommended design and development standards;
 - b. Initiate an overlay zone for Victoria Avenue;
 - c. Design & development standards along Victoria Avenue; and
 - d. Designate Victoria Avenue as a linear park

BACKGROUND

- 4. Since 2003, the City has:
 - a. Initiated a Master Plan for Parks; and
 - b. Implemented policies requiring developers to plant rows of citrus along Victoria.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS

Citrus Greening Disease - Huanglongbing (HLB):

- 1. First detected in California in 2008;
- 2. Introducing more citrus trees increases potential to impact citrus heritage/character; and
- 3. Citrus quarantine is in effect.

ALTERNATIVE SPECIES

- 1. Citrus is the only tree given current policy direction;
- 2. Department of Food & Agriculture advises against new citrus:
- 3. Victoria Avenue Forever (VAF) Identified alternatives; and
- 4. Possible alternatives could include Figs, Pomegranates, Persimmons, Apricots & Plums.

CITRUS POLICY

- 1. Request:
 - a. Land Use Committee to re-evaluate the citrus policy & consider alternate tree options.
- 2. Considerations:
 - a. Victoria Avenue National Register Historic Designation; and
 - b. Tree maintenance.

PROPOSITION R AND MEASURE C

- 1. Victoria Avenue within the Greenbelt;
- 2. Planting trees furthers interest of Proposition R and Measure C; and
- 3. Ballot measure required.

 - b. Private Property Owners
