PROPOSAL

Proposed amendments were initiated to:

- 1. Align with California Energy Commission Standards for outdoor lighting;
- 2. Fulfill settlement agreement with the Friends of the Hills; and
- 3. Integrate with RPU's Street Lighting Conversion project.

BACKGROUND

California Energy Commission Standards

- 1. Establishes Lighting Zones with "power allowances";
- 2. Lighting Zones range from 0 through 4:
 - a. Default zone boundaries based on:
 - 1. U.S. Census "urban" and "rural"; and
 - 2. Government parks, recreation and wilderness areas.
 - b. Riverside is within "urban" U.S. Census boundary; and
 - c. Jurisdictions may deviate from default zones.

BACKGROUND

- 1. Preserving the Dark Sky 2008 settlement agreement with Friends of the Hills:
 - a) Add "night time sky" regulations to Zoning Code; and
 - b) Include recommendations for Mount Palomar Observatory.
- 2. RPU Street Lighting Conversion Project Convert streetlights to LED:
 - a) Consultant scope of work includes Zoning revisions; and
 - b) Energy efficiency and cost savings.

DISCUSSION

Proposed changes to 19.556 – Lighting:

- 1. Reorganize and expand regulations of existing Chapter 19.556;
- 2. Update definitions to reflect changes in technology (i.e. LED);
- 3. Specify Lighting Plan Review & certification;
- 4. Prohibits lighting that is a public danger or nuisance;
- 5. Development standards tailored to individual lighting zones (i.e. max. lumens, mounting heights, allowable light trespass); and
- 6. Restrict light spectrum to 3000 Kelvin or less.

DISCUSSION

Proposed Lighting Zones:

<u>Zone 0</u>: Undeveloped areas of parks, recreation areas & wildlife preserves

Little or no light

<u>Zone 1</u>: Developed portions of parks, recreation areas, wildlife preserves & Mt. Palomar Observatory influence

Low level of light

Zone 2: RA-5, RC & RR Zones


Moderate level of light

Zone 3: Areas not in Zones 0, 1 or 2

Moderately high level of light
