ISSUE:

BACKGROUND:

In an effort to improve communication to the Park and Recreation Commission (Commission), to effectively engage the public on Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department (PRCSD) affairs at appropriate intervals, and to provide efficient use of staff time, PRCSD issues a quarterly report to showcase noteworthy accomplishments and keep the Commission and public informed about the benefits and positive impact of PRCSD operations.

DISCUSSION:

During July - September 2018, PRCSD had their busy summer season filled with highly-anticipated programs and special events. The attached Quarterly Report showcases the PRCSD's accomplishments.

During this quarter, both State Assemblywoman Cervantes and Senator Roth recognized the Youth Innovation Center at Arlington Park at its groundbreaking event. The Recreation and Community Services Division had great attendance numbers in their aquatics and summer programming sessions. The Planning and Design Division is excited for the Martha McLean Anza Narrows Park's new 18-hole disc golf course, which is now open for play. Special Transportation has continued high numbers in transporting seniors and the disabled adult communities. Lastly, the Parks Division hit their high numbers in completing 338 call center service requests and 469 work orders, even with the triple digit heat days!

The entire department continues to maintain high standards in providing services to the community and its residents.
