


Bid No. RPU – 7623 GRANULAR ACTIVATED CARBON REMOVAL AND REPLACEMENT

Riverside Public Utilities

BACKGROUND

- 1. Palmyrita Water Treatment Facility removes organic compounds 1, 2-dibromo-3-chloropropane and 1,2,3-Trichloropropane from groundwater produced in North Orange well field
- 2. Treatment is achieved by using granular activated carbon (GAC) to absorb organic compounds, which is US EPA approved drinking water treatment method



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BACKGROUND

- 3. Approximately 2.5 billion gallons of groundwater are treated annually at Palmyrita for domestic use
- 4. 3-year contract includes approximately 50 GAC removal and replacement events or approximately 16 removal and replacement events each year
- 5. Work includes replacing 20,000 lbs. of GAC per vessel
 - a. Removing and legally disposing of spent carbon
 - b. Inspecting and disinfecting the vessels



c. Adding virgin carbon into the vessels

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DISCUSSION

- 1. October 2, 2018 Advertised Bid No. RPU-7623 for GAC removal and replacement
 - a. Bids were opened on October 17, 2018
- 2. Prominent Systems, Inc. was lowest responsive and responsible bidder
- 3. All documentation was reviewed and determined that Prominent Systems, Inc. has met all specification requirements
