SUBJECT: COMMUNITY POLICE REVIEW COMMISSION INTERVIEWS AND APPOINTMENTS

ISSUE:

Conduct interviews and appoint to fill Wards 4 and 6 seats on the Community Police Review Commission.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Mayor and City Council conduct interviews and appoint to fill:

- 1. Ward 4 seat on the Community Police Review Commission for a term through March 1, 2021; and
- 2. Ward 6 seat on the Community Police Review Commission for term through March 1, 2021.

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY:

Section XIV(A) of the City Council Rules of Procedure and Order of Business (Resolution No. 23344) provides that for vacancies on the Community Police Review Commission, Board of Ethics, Planning Commission, and Board of Public Utilities, the Mayor's Nominating and Screening Committee reviews applications submitted and identifies applicants for interview with the Mayor and City Council. The City Clerk notifies the City Council of those selected for interview. The Mayor and each member of the City Council may add an additional applicant for interview, if desired. The Mayor and City Council vote on the appointments following the interviews. With a full quorum, five affirmative votes are required.

The Mayor's Nominating and Screening Committee met on December 18, 2018, with Chair Bailey and Members Melendrez, Gardner, and Conder present, and unanimously recommended that the City Council interview Eileen M. Teichert, Ronald A. Farris, Carlos Vazquez, Bryan S. Owens, and Phil DeBrier for the Ward 4 seat; and Johnny R. Wilder and Norma O. Berrellez for the Ward 6 seat on the Community Police Review Commission.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Recruitment and appointment costs are funded in the City Clerk's Office budget.
