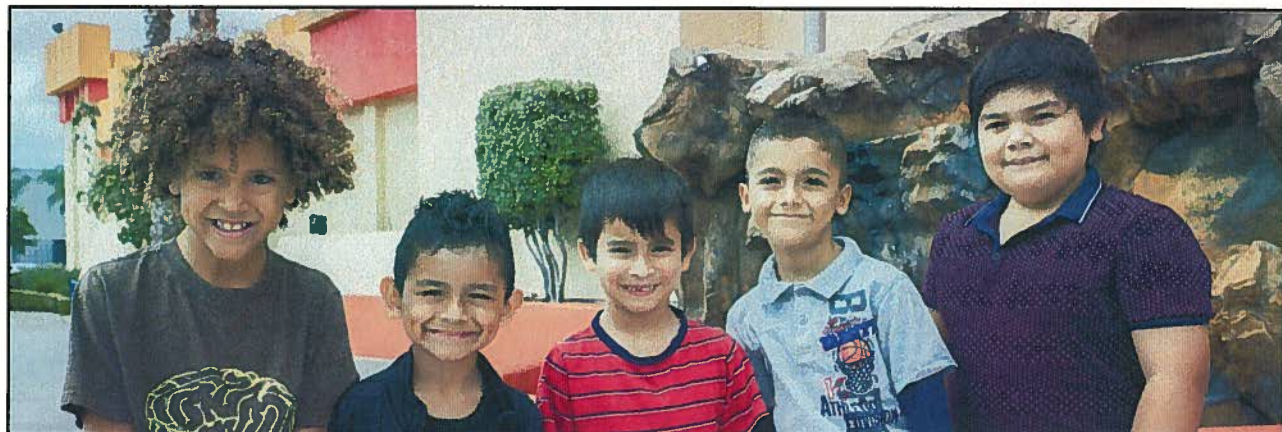
The opportunity gap widens socially and academically for youth facing adversity



- 10x** Low-income students are **10 times more likely to drop out of high school** than high-income peers
- Each one of the 1.2 million dropouts annually **costs the economy approximately \$292,000**
- Among dropouts between the ages of 16 and 24, **incarceration rates were 63 times higher** than among college graduates
- Juvenile justice facilities cost an average of **\$240.99** per day per youth
- 57%** of minority students **don't go to college**
