BACKGROUND

- Bird Scooters were deployed in the City in September 2018;
- Lime Scooters followed with deployment in October 2018; and
- 3. Additional companies are expected to deploy.

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SHARED SCOOTERS

- 1. Scooters are stand-up electric with two wheels;
- 2. Maximum speed of 15 MPH (22411 CVC);
- 3. Must be 18 years of age (a helmet is not required with the adoption of AB 2989 on January 1, 2019);
- 4. Users encouraged to ride in dedicated bicycle facilities; and
- 5. Companies largely rely upon users to 'balance' and charge scooters.

CITY ACTION

- Issued a notice to Bird requiring compliance with the municipal code;
- 2. Complaints logged by 311 and relayed to Bird and Lime; and
- 3. Requested access to data, and changes to their user interface.

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RESIDENT FEEDBACK

- 1. The City has received 311 complaints regarding scooters blocking the right of way; Bird has been quick to address; and
- 2. Many residents and businesses have expressed praise for the program and have requested permanent parking locations with street furniture being installed.

INTERIM OPERATING AGREEMENT

- 1. To address Operating Regulations, Parking Guidelines, and System Operations;
- 2. Master Agreement to be established with multiple companies;
- 3. Key Issues:
 - a) Operating Regulations
 - b) Parking Guidelines
 - c) System Operations
- d) Speed Control
- e) Maximum fleet size
- f) Indemnity language



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PERMITTING AND FEE PROGRAM

- 1. Would allow the City to create and promote safe parking areas and rider behavior;
- 2. Will collaborate with companies such as Bird & Lime;
- 3. NACTO and OCTA have published 'best practices' for public agencies; and
- 4. Anticipate bringing the program for consideration in late February/early March.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

- 1. Approve the Master Interim Operating Agreement to authorize and regulate the operation of Shared Scooter Services in the City; and
- 2. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute individual Interim Operating Agreements for operation of Shared Scooter Services under the terms set forth in the Master Interim Operating Agreement.
