PHILOSOPHY OF PRIORITY BASED BUDGETING

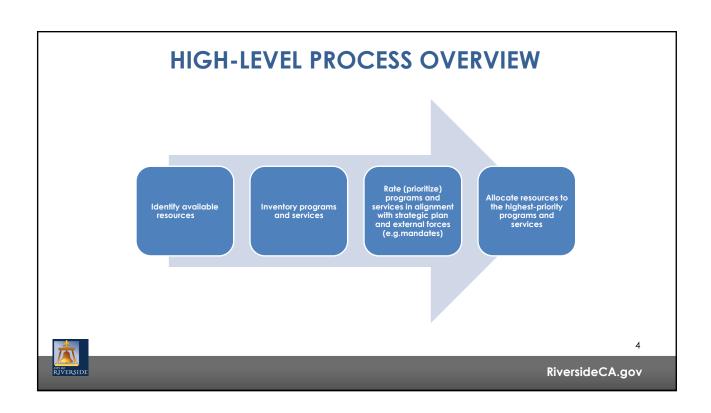
- ✓ Prioritize Services

- ✓ Provide transparency of service impact
- ✓ Demand accountability for results

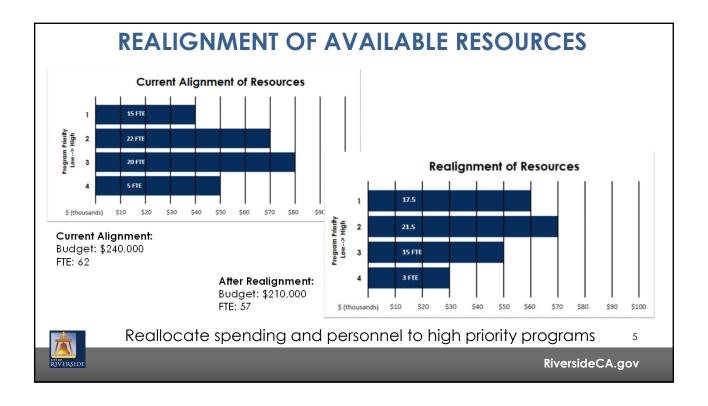

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CHALLENGES

- 1. Requires a major shift from traditional budgeting
- 2. Need a clear understanding of the priority-driven budgeting philosophy
- 3. Need support from Department Heads, Electeds and CMO's Office
 - a. Not a process that fixes a structural deficit
 - b. It becomes the WAY an organization approaches the resource allocation process
- 4. Brings with it an important cultural shift
