Re: Revocation of Massage Establishment Permit for Healing Hands Spa

Dear Mr. Liu,

As part of an ongoing effort to combat Human Trafficking, the Riverside Police Department (RPD) Vice Unit, examined a website commonly used for prostitution advertisements. During that process, an advertisement for your client's business, Healing Hands Spa, located at 6702 Magnolia Avenue, in the City of Riverside, was discovered. To verify if any prohibited activity was occurring, the RPD Vice Unit conducted two separate undercover operations at the business that confirmed prohibited conduct was in fact occurring at Healing Hands Spa on December 28, 2018 and again on January 3, 2019. During these visits, the RPD ascertained uncontroverted evidence that prohibited conduct was being conducted by an employee at this business in violation of Riverside Municipal Code 5.52.080 (C)(2). As a result of the allegations that your client's business, Healing Hands Spa, failed to act in a manner that comports with the peace, health, safety, good morals, and general welfare of the public, a recommendation was made to revoke the Massage Establishment Permit for Healing Hands Spa.

This prompted your client to exercise his right to appeal and schedule a hearing with RPD's Deputy Chief of Operations prior to the revocation of the Massage Establishment Permit.


On February 8, 2019, the Deputy Chief of Operations conducted a hearing to determine if you or your client had any evidence that refuted the factual allegations that lead to the proposed revocation. After careful review of the information you provided, it was determined that there was no evidence that refuted the alleged conduct, and sufficient grounds existed to uphold the revocation of the permit. As such, the revocation of the Massage Establishment Permit for Healing Hands Spa is upheld.



Your client has the right to appeal this decision to the City Council's Public Safety Committee by notifying the City Clerk within ten (10) calendar days after receiving this correspondence pursuant to RMC Section 5.52.140. However, Healing Hands must remain closed until the Public Safety Committee hears the appeal and a decision is made on whether or not to uphold the revocation of your client's Massage Establishment Permit.

Please be advised that your client is responsible for providing a language interpreter if one is needed. The City of Riverside will not arrange for or provide a language interpreter.
