Between 1969-1970 the CA Wildlife Conservation Board began looking at the Santa Ana River as a potential location for a wildlife area


Hidden Valley Wildlife Area was born!

The Nature Center opened its doors in October of 1975









Located North of the La Sierra Acres Neighborhood in Riverside along the most scenic and undisturbed reaches of the Santa Ana River.

An estimated 182 different types of birds species frequent this area, which is a 95% riparian (the areas bordering rivers) corridor along the river's watershed.




