SUBJECT: ESTABLISHMENT OF TIMED NO PARKING ZONE ON ROYAL PALM

BOULEVARD - RESOLUTION

ISSUE:

Establish a "No Parking between the hours of 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. daily" zone along the entirety of the cul-de-sac at the southwesterly termination of Royal Palm Boulevard.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council adopt a resolution to establish a "No Parking between the hours of 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. daily" zone along the entirety of the cul-de-sac at the southwesterly termination of Royal Palm Boulevard.

BOARD RECOMMENDATION:

On February 6, 2019, the Transportation Board reviewed this matter; six of eight members were present. The Board voted unanimously to recommend establishment of the proposed No Parking between the hours of 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. daily zone along the entirety of the cul-de-sac at the southwesterly termination of Royal Palm Boulevard.

BACKGROUND:

The City works with residents and local businesses to establish various time restricted parking zones. Time restricted parking zones are utilized to control parking availability and may help to minimize safety, noise, or other concerns generated by parking during specific times of the day. Establishment of time restricted parking zones requires submission of a petition from immediately impacted residents or businesses showing support from a minimum of 75% of tenants or owners for the proposed time restricted parking zone. Once the petition criteria have been met, the proposal is scheduled for consideration by the Transportation Board which makes recommendation to the City Council regarding the matter.

DISCUSSION:

The Public Works Department received a petition from eighty percent (80%) of residents on Royal Palm Boulevard requesting establishment of a "no parking between the hours of 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. daily" zone along the entirety of the cul-de-sac at the southwesterly termination of Royal Palm Boulevard. Residents indicate nighttime parking generates undesirable and illicit activity as well as noise and safety concerns for residents.

Establishment of the proposed timed No Parking zone would restrict late night and early morning parking along the entirety of the cul-de-sac at the southwesterly termination of Royal Palm Boulevard.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost of signs is estimated to be \$108. Sufficient funding is available in the existing Public Works Department budget, Signing Supplies account number 4110100-424143.
