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IRREVOCABLE SUPPLEMENTAL §115 PENSION TRUST

- 1. Can only be used to:
 - A. Reimburse City for CalPERS contributions
 - B. Make payments directly to CalPERS
- 2. Investments significantly less restricted than City investment funds
 - A. Fiduciary rules govern Trust investments
 - B. Usually, designed for long term returns
- 3. Over 100 trusts established, mostly since 2015
 - A. Trust providers: PARS, PFM, Keenan
 - B. California Employers' Pension Prefunding Trust (CEPPT) is coming

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IRREVOCABLE SUPPLEMENTAL §115 PENSION TRUST

- 1. More flexibility than paying CalPERS directly
 - A. City decides if and when and how much money to put into Trust
 - B. City decides if and when and how much to withdraw to pay CalPERS or reimburse Agency
- 2. Funding strategies typically focus on
 - A. Reducing the unfunded liability
- 3. Stabilizing contribution rates
 - A. Mitigate expected contribution rates to better manage budget
- 4. Combination
 - A. Use funds for rate stabilization/budget predictability
 - B. Target increasing fund balance to pay off UAL sooner

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RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Budget Engagement Commission:

- Receive and provide input on the establishment of a Section 115 Pension Trust Fund to help with the fiscal Management of the California Public Employees Retirement System long-term liability; and
- 2. Recommend that the City Council approve the proposed establishment of a Section 115 Pension Trust Fund to help with the fiscal Management of the California Public Employees Retirement System long-term liability.

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
