

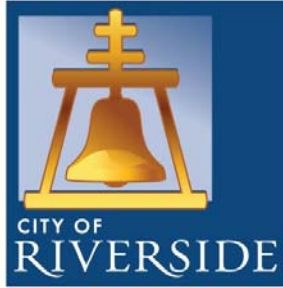

<b><u>PLANNING CASE P19-0073</u></b> – City Landmark Designation, Farm House Motel - 1393 University Avenue, Ward 2										
Proposed historic designation by Alyssa Digangi of Bailey California Properties to designate the Farm House Motel as a City Landmark. Scott Watson, Associate Planner, presented the staff report. Alyssa Digangi, Project Manager, Bailey California Properties, LLC stated they were excited for this project. She stated they supported staff's determination. There were no public comments at this time. The Cultural Heritage Board recommended that the City Council: 1. Determine that Planning Case P19-0073, City Landmark Designation, is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15308 of the CEQA Guidelines as it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment, that said action is intended to preserve the historic character of the building and site and provide notice of the historic status; and 2. Mr. Watson updated the Board on the Mills Act Program. Following discussion by Board regarding the status of the Mills Act, the Board took no formal action.										



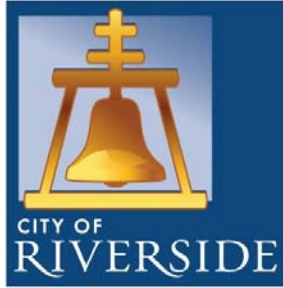
