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## RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, (1) APPROVING AND ESTABLISHING REVISED ELECTRIC RULE 6 AND WATER RULE 6, EFFECTIVE UPON ADOPTION; AND (2) MAKING RELATED FINDINGS OF FACT

WHEREAS, the City of Riverside ("City") by and through its Public Utilities Department ("RPU") is obligated to: (1) serve its water and electric customers safe, reliable and equitably priced water and electricity; (2) operate its Electric and Water Utilities in an efficient and economical manner; and (3) operate, maintain and preserve its Electric and Water Utilities in good repair and working order; and

WHEREAS, RPU is responsible for operating the Electric and Water Utilities in such a manner that revenues from the sale of electric and water shall at least equal the costs of operation, including all maintenance and operating, administrative and general, debt service, capital improvements, tax-related payments and other costs incurred in complying with prudent utility business practices; and

WHEREAS, RPU staff submitted to the City's Board of Public Utilities ("Board") proposed revisions to Electric Rule 6 and Water Rule 6; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing, notice of which was duly published in <u>The Press-Enterprise</u> on February 24, 2019 and March 3, 2019, in compliance with Government Code Sections 66018 and 6062a, was held on March 11, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. before the Board of Public Utilities to consider the revisions noted herein; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2019, the Board adopted Resolution 2019-1, approving the revisions to Electric Rule 6 and Water Rule 6 referenced herein; and

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2019, the City Council considered the proposed revisions to Electric Rule 6 and Water Rule 6 referenced herein and conceptually approved changes to Electric Rule 6 and Water Rule 6 which include reducing the time periods used to calculate billing of undercharges for non-residential accounts from three (3) years to six (6) monthly billing periods, changing the terminology of the time period used to calculate overcharges from one (1) year to twelve (12) monthly billing periods, and changing the period used to calculate billing of

overcharges for fast meters to be consistent with the monthly billing period for general overcharges; and

WHEREAS, however, the City Council did not approve the portion of the proposed Electric Rule 6 and Water Rule 6 changes, which increased the undercharge calculation for residential customers from four (4) to six (6) monthly billing periods, and requested that the Board of Public Utilities reconsider making such a change so as to avoid unduly burdening residential customers; and

WHEREAS, after considering all staff and public comment thereon and City Council direction, on May 13, 2019, the Board rescinded its prior Resolution No. 2019-1 and adopted and established the proposed revisions to Electric Rule 6 and Water Rule 6, all to be effective upon approval by the City Council.

## NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED:

Section 1: That the findings of fact of the Board of Public Utilities made in its Resolution No. 2019-2, which Resolution is attached hereto as Attachment 1 and incorporated herein in its entirety by this reference, are hereby adopted as findings of the City Council.

Section 2: That the Public Utilities Department is directed to prepare and file the Notice of Exemption and such other documents as are required by the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.) in connection with the proposed rule revisions.

Section 3: That the revised Electric Rule 6 and Water Rule 6, all as set forth in Exhibit A to Attachment 1, are hereby approved under and pursuant to Section 1202(e) of the Charter of the City of Riverside, California, and shall become effective as of the date of this resolution.
