## **DISCUSSION:**

This event is free to attend and open to everyone. Whether you have a disability or not, this event is sure to have something for you. This year, vendors will range from mobility and in-home services to craft boutiques and food booths. There will also be photobooths, face painters, craft making stations, games and music, all for guests to enjoy at no cost.

The Inland Regional Center (IRC) is bringing it's popular annual resource fair, featuring fun, games, food, and resources to beautiful downtown Riverside. Fall Festival 2019 will take place on Main Street (between 10th Street and University Avenue) on Sunday, October 27<sup>th</sup>. This event connects Inland Empire families with services available to people with developmental disabilities while celebrating the disability community in a fun carnival atmosphere. Equally important, it gives the IRC community a chance to laugh, smile, dance and be silly together. This event is a celebration of disability, inclusion, and community.

IRC is a springboard to greater independence for people with developmental disabilities in the Inland Empire. As a non-profit agency, IRC has provided support to people with intellectual disabilities, autism, cerebral palsy, and epilepsy since 1972. Today, IRC provides case

management and service coordination for more than 33,000 consumers in Riverside and San Bernardino counties.
