SUBJECT: COMMUNITY POLICE REVIEW COMMISSION WARD 1 VACANCY

ISSUE:

Review and discuss applicant pool for the Ward 1 seat on the Community Police Review Commission to include previously interviewed applicants.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council appoint an applicant to the Ward 1 seat on the Community Police Review Commission for a term ending March 1, 2023.

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY:

On June 25, 2019, the Mayor and City Council interviewed Violet L. Gutierrez, Michelle M. Rios, Isaac Hiraes, and Rico A. Alderette for the Ward 1 seat on the Community Police Review Commission and appointed Violet L. Gutierrez to the Community Police Review Commission for a term ending March 1, 2023. Subsequently, Ms. Gutierrez declined the appointment to the Community Police Review Commission and notified the City Clerk on September 25, 2019. Following the interviews, Rico Alderette was appointed to the Transportation Board.

Section XIV(A) of the City Council Rules of Procedure and Order of Business (Resolution No. 23437) provides that for vacancies on the Community Police Review Commission, Board of Ethics, Planning Commission, and Board of Public Utilities, the Mayor's Nominating and Screening Committee reviews applications submitted and identifies applicants for interview with the Mayor and City Council. Mayor's Nominating and Screening Committee Chair Bailey and Councilmember Gardner recommend appointment to the Ward 1 seat on Community Police Review Commission from the previously interviewed applicants. With a full quorum, five affirmative votes are required.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Recruitment and appointment costs are funded in the City Clerk's Office budget.
