SUBJECT: 2008/09 GRANT APPLICATION REQUEST FOR COMPRESSED NATURAL GAS VEHICLE MAINTENANCE FACILITY PROJECT – INCREASE ESTIMATED REVENUES AND SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

### **ISSUE:**

The issue before the City Council is whether to authorize the submission of a grant application to the California Department of Transportation, for the Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) Vehicle Maintenance Facility project located at the City of Riverside Corporation Yard.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

That the City Council:

- 1. Ratify approval to submit grant application, in the amount of \$1,500,000, to the California Department of Transportation;
- 2. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all necessary documents to implement the approval of the grant applications;
- 3. Upon grant award, authorize an increase in estimated revenue in the amount of \$1,500,000 to an interest-bearing revenue account as assigned by the Finance Division; and
- 4. Upon grant award, increase appropriations in the amount of \$1,500,000 to the CNG Vehicle Maintenance Facility project account as assigned by the Finance Division.

# BACKGROUND:

The Parks, Recreation, and Community Services Department/ Special Transportation section became aware of an opportunity to request additional grant funds from the California Department of Transportation for the CNG Vehicle Maintenance Facility project located at the City of Riverside Corporation Yard. Due to the need to meet required deadlines, staff sought City Manager's interim approval to submit a grant application and is hereby seeking City Council's ratification of approval to submit grant application in the amount of \$1,500,000 for construction of CNG vehicle maintenance facility. The CNG Vehicle Maintenance Facility project was originally approved by the Riverside

County Transportation Commission (RCTC) in the 2006/07 Short Range Transit Plan (SRTP); and the proposed funding source and amount for this project was approved by RCTC in the 2008/09 SRTP on June 11, 2008. Staff originally intended to apply for funding for this project from the Federal Transit Administration: however, staff became aware of an additional grant funding opportunity through the Public Transportation Modernization, Improvement and Service Enhancement Account (PTMISEA) program available through the California Department of Transportation.

The CNG Vehicle Maintenance Facility project entails the design and construction of a vehicle maintenance facility suited to maintain CNG vehicles. The construction of this facility will result in a state-of-the-art maintenance facility in compliance with all health and safety regulations pertaining to indoor air quality, including a gas detection system with alarms, warning lights and exhaust fans. Utilization of the facility will improve maintenance productivity by reducing individual vehicle downtimes, and enhance the safety of both maintenance personnel and City infrastructure.

On October 7, 2008, the City Council approved the professional services agreement with PJHM Architects, Inc. of San Clemente, CA in the amount of \$215,000 for the architectural and engineering design for the construction of the CNG vehicle maintenance facility. The agreement was signed on November 12, 2008.

# FISCAL IMPACT:

Upon award, estimated revenues and appropriations will increase by \$1,500,000 in project account for CNG vehicle maintenance facility construction. The PTMISEA grant requires no matching funds.

Write here: The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department Special Transportation Division would like to apply for grant funds in order to construct a fleet bay. Special Transportation operates an alternative fuel (compressed natural gas and propane) vehicle fleet comprised of 26 vehicles. Special Transportation currently maintains its vehicles in the City of Riverside's fleet bay which is not suited to maintain alternative fuel vehicles. Special Transportation must also share space in the maintenance bay with other city vehicles. In order to comply with the National Fire Protection Agency guidelines and in order to enhance maintenance capacity, funding was acquired to construct a new maintenance fleet bay, however, additional funding is required. The useful life of the fleet bay is over 30 years. The fleet bay project itself is included in the 2006/07 Short Range Transit Plan; the request for additional funding is included in the 2008/09 Short Range Transportation Plan (attached). Staff originally intended on applying for Federal funds (Federal Transit Administration, 5307 funds); in the interest of time, availability and security, staff has decided to apply for the PTMISEA funds that are available.

Write brief summary here: Special Transportation currently utilizes alternative fuel vehicles for its operation and does not have its own fleet bay. Vehicles are maintained in the City of Riverside's fleet bay, which is not suited to maintain alternative fuel vehicles and is used to maintain other city vehicles. The design and construction of a new CNG vehicle maintenance facility, complete with all required safety equipment such as gas detection, alarms, warning lights and exhaust fans will create an industry state of the art facility in complete compliance with all regulations pertaining to working on these vehicles indoors. Constructing a fleet bay suited for maintaining alternative fuel vehicles will improve the safety of the maintenance personnel and infrastructure. Please see attached document detailing the fleet bay expansion project scope of services.

#### SCOPE OF SERVICES

PJHM Architects, Inc. together with Burnett and Burnette will provide the following services to the City of Riverside for the construction of a Special Transportation Compressed Natural Gas Vehicle Maintenance Facility at the City Corporation Yard.

Building shall be equipped with 3 service bays (2 deep) for heavy-duty vehicles (>26,000#GVW), with drive through capabilities. Service bays shall have roll up type doors on both ends of the building.
- The building shall have limited office space in addition to parts storage and restroom facilities of a size to be determined at a later date.
- The building shall be equipped with HVAC of adequate size and capability for the square footage of the building.
- The building shall have footings and foundations of adequate design to accommodate above ground rotary vehicle lifts of sizes to be determined at a later date.
- The building shall be equipped with all the equipment and devices to make it completely compliant with all governing laws, codes and regulations that apply to CNG vehicle maintenance facilities including but not limited to a gas detection system, PLC unit, approved air ventilators, approved apace heaters, automatic opening/closing doors, audio and visual annunciation and/or any other equipment or device required to achieve building compliance.

- 7. Alarm strategy for notice and evacuation based on flammability levels
- 8. 2 hour fire rated internal doors. All windows to be fracture-resistant
- 9. Isolating storage of flammable materials
- 10. No subsurface pits
- 11. No skylights or ceiling pockets where gas can be trapped
- Roof/ceiling beam and structural support design that will not allow trapped gas in the ceiling area
- 13. Type and location of safety signs-

We plan to use Section 2211 exceptions that permit the use of several exceptions as noted below:

- 1. Complete exception to Section 2211 if no fuel work is done inside the garage.
- Use of minimum ventilation (gravity vents) if natural ventilation is approved by a Professional Engineer.
- 3. Continuous operation of some of the fans to avoid electrical system interlocking
- 4. Gas system activation

These exceptions, in additional to some minor garage CNG vehicle operational restrictions, will have to be discussed with the City of Riverside staff, and then negotiated with the City of Riverside Fire Department. Approval of the exceptions could result in as much as 25% to 30% savings on CNG design features and cost of the repair garage.
