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
DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

The CAO has 39 full-time equivalent (FTE) positions. The Department is comprised of three divisions to provide support to Council and City Departments:

- Litigation (includes Workers' Compensation and Tort Claims Processing Divisions)
- Public Safety (includes Measure Z and Community Advocacy Program)
- ➤ Municipal Services

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PRIORITIES


- Continue to reduce outside litigation costs
- Improve quality of life issues through prosecution of the RMC and Community Livability Programs
- Retain and attract highly qualified and dedicated staff to provide the highest quality of legal services to the City
- Aggressively defend Riverside's interests and resources
- Promote open and honest transparent government
- Aggressively coordinate with City and County Law Enforcement to address Neighborhood Livability issues
- Enhance revenue recovery




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


DEPARTMENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Reduction of Outside Counsel Costs
 - Litigation and Workers' Compensation cases brought in-house (see graph and table)
- Reduction of Tort Claims Administration Costs
 - Tort Claims processing brought in-house (see table)
- Litigation Successes (see slide)
- Public Safety Successes (see slide)
- Revenue Recovery
 - Although not a revenue generating department, the CAO returned \$200,000 to the general fund from the recovery of attorney's fee awards, costs, civil penalties and damages; \$88,000 solely from receiverships and marijuana dispensaries actions.

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LITIGATION SUCCESSES

- City Riverside v Rubidoux Community Services District
 - Judgment for Riverside
- Onstad v City of Riverside Excessive Force (Demand \$2 million)
 - Settlement \$1
- Burtis v City of Riverside Alleged Dangerous Design (Demand \$2 million)
 - Summary judgment granted

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PUBLIC SAFETY

- WAT Successes:
 - Received 344 neighborhood problems 72% fully resolved
 - Attended 56 community meetings
- Public Safety Division was first in Western Riverside County to obtain Gun Violence Restraining Orders
 - Worked closely with Riverside Police Department to take 65 firearms from individuals who present a danger to self-harm or harm to others
- Defend Lawsuits for City and RPD Officers
 - Saved \$717,593 in outside counsel costs compared to 2015



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SPECIAL PROGRAMS

- Special Programs provide funds generally necessary to:
 - Continue implementation of the Community Advocacy and Ward Action Team Programs;
 - Assist with the funding of unanticipated future legal costs and expenses on behalf of other City Departments;
 - Enables the CAO to continue to further the goals and objectives of the Mayor and City Council in improving the quality of life in the City; and
 - Expenditures are largely Council-driven



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
