Following discussion and without formal motion, the City Council received and ordered filed the homeless solutions update.

MINUTES

The Minutes of the City Council meetings of February 4, 11, and 14, 2020, were approved as presented.

BOARD AND COMMISSION APPOINTMENTS AND RESIGNATIONS

The Mayor and City Council (1) appointed Shakisha L. Mounsey to the Ward 1 Business seat on the Budget Engagement Commission for a term ending March 1, 2022; (2) appointed Cassandra Gonzalez-Kester to the Ward 5 Business seat on the Budget Engagement Commission for a term ending March 1, 2021; (3) accepted the resignation of

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Jennifer Humphreys from the Park and Recreation Commission Ward 5 seat, effective immediately; (4) accepted the resignation of Andrew C. Walcker from the Budget Engagement Commission Ward 5 Business seat, effective immediately, and (5) requested the City Clerk to process the vacancies.

PUBLIC MEETINGS AND PUBLIC RECORDS - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED The City Council introduced an ordinance amending Title 4 Public Meetings and Public Records of the Riverside Municipal Code to (1) increase the concurrence from one to two members of the City Council for the Mayor or Member of the City Council to add an item to a published agenda; and (2) require that a report added after the twelve-day publication include an explanation and documentation of why immediate action is needed; whereupon, an Ordinance entitled; "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Section 4.05.050 of the Riverside Municipal Code - Public Meetings and Public Records," was presented and introduced.

HOUSING AUTHORITY - AGREEMENT AMENDMENT - 9830 COUNTY FARM ROAD

The Housing Authority (1) approved the First Amendment to the Loan Agreement with Riverside Cedar Glen Partners II LP, to reflect new 50-unit configuration and affordability requirements pursuant to the receipt of No Place Like Home funding and Federal Low-Income Housing Tax Credits received for the development located at 9830 County Farm Road; and (2) authorized the Executive Director, or his designee, to execute the First Amendment to a Loan Agreement with Riverside Cedar Glen Partners II LP, including making minor corrections as necessary.

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JOINT ITEM WITH HOUSING AUTHORITY - GRANT DEED - TRANSFER VACANT LAND - 2656 AND 2666 FOURTEENTH The City Council (1) based on the findings contained in the written staff report, declared as exempt surplus land two City-owned vacant properties located at 2656 and 2666 14th Street totaling .22 acre and bearing Assessor's Parcel Numbers 221-084-005 and 221-184-004; (2) authorized transfer of the properties to the Housing Authority for \$1.00 to facilitate future affordable housing development; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all appropriate documents, including making minor and non-substantive changes, to complete the transaction. The Housing Authority (1) authorized purchase of the City-owned vacant land located at 2656 and 2666 14th Street, totaling .22 acres and bearing Assessor's Parcel Numbers 221-084-005 and 221-084-004 for \$1.00 to facilitate future affordable housing development; and (2) authorized the Executive Director, or his designee, to execute all appropriate documents, including making minor and non-substantive changes, to complete the transaction. JOINT ITEM WITH HOUSING AUTHORITY AND SUCCESSOR AGENCY -AGREEMENTS - PROPERTY MAINTENANCE SERVICES - RESOLUTION The City Council (1) approved the Services Agreement with Lyle Castillo, dba Twin Builders, for property maintenance services of Cityowned properties in the amount of \$800,000 for a three-year term with the option to extend the agreement for two one-year terms; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Services Agreement including making minor non-substantive changes, and the optional two one-year extensions for property maintenance services of City-owned properties. The Housing Authority (1) approved the Services Agreement with Lyle Castillo, dba Twin Builders, for property maintenance services of Housing Authority-owned properties in the amount of \$500,000 for a three-year term with the option to extend the agreement for two one-year extensions; and (2) authorized the Executive Director or his

designee to execute the Services Agreement including making minor

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non-substantive changes, and the optional two one-year extensions for property maintenance services of Housing Authority-owned properties.

The Successor Agency (1) adopted a resolution authorizing the Successor Agency to enter into a Services Agreement for Property Maintenance Services with Lyle Castillo, dba Twin Builders in the amount of \$800,000 for a three-year term with the option to extend the agreement for two one-year extensions; (2) recommended that the Countywide Oversight Board adopt a resolution authorizing the Successor Agency to enter into a Services Agreement for Property Maintenance Services with Lyle Castillo, dba Twin Builders, in the amount of \$800,000 for a three-year term with the option to extend the agreement for two one-year extensions; and (3) authorized the Executive Director or his designee to execute the Services Agreement, including making minor non-substantive changes, and the optional two one-year extensions, for property maintenance services of Successor Agency-owned properties; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 38 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, as Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Riverside Authorizing a Services Agreement with Lyle Castillo, DBA Twin Builders, for Property Maintenance Services for Successor Agency-Owned Properties, was presented and adopted.

SURPLUS DECLARATION - PUBLIC PARKING CITY-OWNED LAND - 3575 VINE

The City Council (1) approved the surplus declaration of approximately 18,026 square feet of City-owned land located at 3575 Vine Street, bearing Assessor's Parcel Number 213-211-008, acquired for permanent parking and the Marketplace sign; and (2) authorized the marketing and sale of the subject property at fair market value in accordance with the City's Administrative Manual 08.003.00 for Disposition and Sale of City-owned Real Property and Government Code Section 54220 et. seq.

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MEASURE Z - BID 7730 - FORD SUPER DUTY F-350 TRUCKS FOR FIRE DEPARTMENT

The City Council awarded Bid 7730 to Fritts Ford, Riverside, California, for purchase of two 2020 Ford Super Duty F-350 crew cab trucks for the Fire Department in the amount of \$107,991.76.

AGREEMENT AMENDMENT - ON-CALL DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT SERVICES AT RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT - 6951 FLIGHT

The City Council (1) approved the First Amendment to the Master Professional Consultant Services Agreement with Mead & Hunt, Inc., increasing total compensation from \$250,000 to \$500,000; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the First Amendment to the Master Professional Consultant Services Agreement, including making minor and non-substantive changes.

MEASURE Z - ORANGECREST FIRE STATION IMPROVEMENTS - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION - 19595 ORANGE TERRACE The City Council approved a supplemental appropriation from the unallocated Measure Z fund balance to fund dormitory improvements to accommodate all genders at the Orangecrest Fire Station No. 11 in the amount of \$100,000.

HUMAN RESOURCES POLICY AND PROCEDURE MANUAL REVISIONS The City Council approved the proposed revisions to City personnel policies for Hours of Work (II-4), Health/Vision and Dental Insurance (V-9), Probation and Probationary Periods (I-5), Telecommuting Program (II-11), and Bilingual or Sign Language Designation (V-16).

2020 STATE OF CALIFORNIA CITIZENS' OPTION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY STATE PROGRAM - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) accepted the grant award from the State of California Citizens' Option for Public Safety Program 2020 in the amount of \$497,248 into Police Department Trust Account No. 0000721-225170; (2) authorized an increase in revenues in the amount of \$497,248 plus projected interest to Grants and Restricted Programs Fund 215, Police Department Project Revenue Account

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and appropriation in expenditures in the same amount to Grants and Restricted Programs Fund 215, Police Department Project Expenditure Account; and (3) authorized the City Manager or designee, on behalf of the City, to execute all necessary documents, including making non-substantive changes.

NORTH AMERICAN ENERGY STANDARDS BOARD BASE CONTRACT - SALE AND PURCHASE OF NATURAL GAS

The City Council (1) approved the North American Energy Standards Board Base Contract for Sale and Purchase of Natural Gas with Tenaska Marketing Ventures for use in the purchase or sale of natural gas under the terms and conditions stated therein for operation of Riverside Energy Resource Center, Springs, and Clearwater natural gas generation facilities; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the North American Energy Standards Board Base Contract, as well as, subsequent transaction confirmation agreements with Tenaska Marketing Ventures, for sales and purchases of natural gas, subject to the terms and conditions of individual North American Energy Standards Board enabling agreements and consistent with the City Council approved Energy Risk Management Policy.

NORTH AMERICAN ENERGY STANDARDS BOARD BASE CONTRACT - SALE AND PURCHASE OF NATURAL GAS

The City Council (1) approved the North American Energy Standards Board Base Contract for Sale and Purchase of Natural Gas with Sempra Gas and Power Marketing, LLC for use in the purchase or sale of natural gas under the terms and conditions stated therein for operation of Riverside Energy Resource Center, Springs, and Clearwater natural gas generation facilities; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the North American Energy Standards Board Base Contract, as well as, subsequent transaction confirmation agreements with Sempra Gas and Power Marketing, LLC, for sales and purchases of natural gas, subject to the terms and conditions of individual North American Energy Standards Board enabling agreements and consistent with the City Council approved Energy Risk Management Policy.

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RENEWAL OF COUNTY SERVICE AREA 152 ASSESSMENT - RESOLUTION The City Council adopted a resolution to renew the current assessment within County Service Area 152 in the City of Riverside for the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Permit at an annual rate of \$10.00 per benefit assessment unit for Fiscal Year 2020/2021; whereupon the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23551 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Renewing the Rate for County Service Area (CSA) 152 to Fund Activities to Comply with the City's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit for Municipal Storm Sewer System (MS4) Discharges for Fiscal Year 2020-2021, was presented and adopted.

SPEED LIMIT ZONES - CENTRAL AND DAY - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED The City Council introduced an ordinance to (1) revise the boundaries of the 45 MPH speed limit zone on Central Avenue from "Canyon Bluff to Chicago Avenue" to "Canyon Creek Drive to Chicago Avenue"; and (2) revise the boundaries of the 40 MPH speed limit zone on southbound Day Street from "Box Springs Road to Eucalyptus Avenue" to "northerly City limits to Eucalyptus Avenue"; whereupon, an Ordinance entitled; "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Section 10.76.010 of the Riverside Municipal Code Designating the Prima Facie Speed Limits for Streets and Portions Thereof in Accordance with the Provisions of Sections 10.20.020 and 10.20.030," was presented and introduced.

MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM - VAN BUREN BOULEVARD SEWER PROJECT

The City Council (1) determined the Van Buren Boulevard sewer installation project between Wood Road and King Avenue and a residential development north of Van Buren Boulevard northwesterly of the intersection of Iris and Chicago Avenues, and Assessor's Parcel No. 245-300-004 will not have a significant effect on the environment based on the analysis and mitigation set forth in the case record therein; and (2) adopted a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program.

CASES P19-0388 AND P19-0389 - GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT REZONING - 9174 AND 9258 INDIANA - RESOLUTION - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED Hearing was called on a proposal by Steve Berzansky of BP Riverside Partners, LLC for the following entitlements to facilitate future development of a multi-family residential development at 9174 and 9258 Indiana Avenue: (a) General Plan Amendment to change the land use designation from MDR- Medium Density Residential to HDR-High Density Residential; and (b) Zoning Code Amendment to change the zone from R-1-7000- Single Family Residential Zone to R-3-1500-Multiple-Family Residential Zone. reading waived, Resolution No. 23552 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Amending the Land Use Designation of the Riverside General Plan 2025 as to the Properties Located at 9174 and 9258 Indiana Avenue, on the South Side of Indiana Avenue between Gibson Street and Jackson Street, from Medium Density Residential to

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High Density Residential, was presented and adopted, and an
Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California,
Amending the Zoning Map of the City of Riverside Pursuant to
Chapter 19.090 of the Riverside Municipal Code by Rezoning
9174 and 9258 Indiana Avenue, Located on the South Side of Indiana
