RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE EVICTION FOR NON-PAYMENT OF RENT FOR RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL TENANTS DURING THE DECLARED LOCAL EMERGENCY, FOR 60 DAYS.

WHEREAS, the California Emergency Services Act (Government Code § 8550, *et seq.*) empowers the City Council of the City of Riverside to declare a Local Emergency when there exist conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the territorial limits of the City of Riverside ("City") which are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the City; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, California Governor Gavin Newsom declared a State of Emergency due to the threat of the Coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on March 8, 2020, the Riverside County Public Health Officer declared a local health emergency based on the imminent threat to public health from COVID-19 in Riverside County; and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020, the County of Riverside proclaimed a local emergency; and WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services of the City, proclaimed a Local Emergency and said proclamation was ratified by the City Council on March 17, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, the Riverside County Public Health Officer ordered the cancellation of gatherings with an expected presence of 10 people or more, thereby effectively closing most small businesses; and

WHEREAS, both the Riverside Unified School District and the Alvord Unified School District have closed their schools until at least April 30, 2020, as well as most universities and colleges locally and around the country have closed and/or have converted to on-line programs, all of which creates a mass exodus of home-bound students to unexpected working parents; and

WHEREAS, with all of the closing of many businesses around the City, County and State due to the various orders of the City, County Public Health Officer and the Governor, many sectors of our local economy have been affected, especially the low-income rental tenants and the small business owners; and

WHEREAS, with the closing of business and the reduction in staff in many others, many low-income renters have either lost their jobs or are working less hours, thereby either completely eliminating or reducing their wages; and

WHEREAS, even for those individuals that are still working, there is also a reduction in hours worked in order to provide child care for the school-aged children now at home; and

WHEREAS, many of these individuals are already living paycheck to paycheck and with the loss of income, impact's their ability to pay monthly rent, thereby leaving them vulnerable to eviction and subsequently possible homelessness; and

WHEREAS, commercial tenants face the same issue in that social distancing and other orders have effectively eliminated revenue flow for many businesses, forcing them to make the decision of paying payroll or paying monthly rent; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-28-20, authorizing local governments to exercise their police powers to adopt limitations on residential and commercial evictions, including the adoption of a temporary moratorium; and

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, President Trump ordered the Federal Housing Finance Authority to suspend foreclosures and evictions of homeowners with an enterprise-backed single-family mortgage and additionally ordered the Department of Housing and Development to suspend evictions of public housing units; and

WHEREAS, a temporary moratorium for non-payment evictions will provide much needed relief to some of the City's most vulnerable, rent-burdened families and small businesses during this Local Emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Riverside hereby declares and orders as follows:

- 1. A temporary moratorium on the eviction of residential and commercial tenants due to non-payment of rent in relation to the COVID-19 crisis is hereby imposed, subject to the following requirements:
- a. The tenant is to notify their landlord before the day the rent is due, with the circumstances surrounding their inability to pay the entire rent.

1	b. If able, the tenant should make an effort to pay a portion of their monthly rent.
2	c. The tenant and the landlord should work out a payment plan with a minimum
3	of four (4) months after the repeal of the Local Emergency in which to pay back the rent owed. No
4	late fees are to be imposed on the late rent.
5	d. The landlord is entitled to collect full monthly rent owed after the repeal of the
6	Local Emergency.
7	2. The temporary moratorium will not relieve the tenant from their obligation to pay rent
8	nor will it restrict the landlord's ability to recover rent that is due after the termination of the
9	moratorium. The landlord's ability to evict a tenant for non-payment of rent due to the COVID-19
10	emergency, is suspended until the Local Emergency is repealed.
11	3. This Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon adoption and shall terminate
12	and be of no further force and effect upon the repeal of the Local Emergency. This Resolution,
13	unless the Local Emergency has been repealed, shall be reviewed by the City Council in 60 days.
