## **ORDER OF THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES**

WHEREAS, Government Code section 8634 empowers the Director of Emergency Services to promulgate orders and regulations necessary to provide for the protection of life and property; and

WHEREAS, Riverside Municipal Code section 9.20.050 empowers the Director of Emergency Services to do the following:

- A. During the existence of a "state of war emergency," or the proclaimed existence of a "state of emergency" or a "local emergency" affecting the City to:
  - 1. Control and direct the effort of the City Emergency Organization.
- 2. Direct cooperation and coordination of services and staff of the City Emergency Organization and resolve questions of authority and responsibility that may arise between them.
- 3. Represent the City in all dealings with public or private agencies on matters pertaining to emergencies.
- 4. Make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by such emergency.
- 5. Obtain vital supplies, equipment, and such other properties found lacking and required for the protection of life and property and to bind the City for the fair value thereof and, if required immediately, to commandeer the same for public use.
- 6. Require emergency services of any City officer or employee and to command the aid of as many citizens of the community as he or she deems necessary in the execution of his or her duties.
  - 7. Requisition necessary personnel or material of any City department or agency.
- 8. Execute all of his or her ordinary power as City Manager, all of the special powers conferred upon him or her by the Riverside Municipal Code, City Council Resolution, City Council approved Emergency Plan, powers conferred upon him or her by any statute, City Council approved agreement, or other lawful authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED by the Director of Emergency Services of the City of Riverside that in due to the procedures put into place to slow down the spread of COVID-19, including the closure of City buildings, in order to minimize the potential economic impacts that may be incurred by the development and construction community, all expiration dates for City issued entitlements and construction related permits are hereby extended for an additional 60 days unless otherwise extended or earlier terminated by City Council. This shall not include parcel and tract map approvals subject to the Subdivision Map Act of the State of California.
