2	AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 6.04 OF THE RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL CODE
3	TO ADD RECYCLING AND ORGANIC RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS FOR RESIDENTIAL SOLID WASTE CUSTOMERS
4	The City Council of the City of Riverside does ordain as follows:
5	<u>Section 1</u> : The title of Chapter 6.04 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as
6	follows:
7	"Chapter 6.04 RESIDENTIAL SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLABLE MATERIAL"
8	Section 2: Section 6.04.010 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:
9	"6.04.010 Definitions.
10	For the purpose of this chapter the following words and phrases shall have the meanings respectively
11	ascribed to them by this section.
12	Bulky item means waste items that are too large to be accepted as part of standard automated
13	or manual collection. Examples of bulky waste include but are not limited to large metal
14	appliances, mattresses, furniture items, large toys or wood trimmings, and other materials
15 16	designated by the Public Works Director pursuant to this chapter, but excludes any hazardous
10	materials.
17	Collection means the set of nicking up and remaving solid waste on reavelable meterials on
	<u>Collection means the act of picking up and removing solid waste or recyclable materials or</u>
	<u>organic recyclable materials at the place of generation.</u>

Detachable bin means a metal container designed for mechanical emptying and provided by the City or contractor where applicable for the accumulation and storage of solid waste.

reconstituted products. Green materials include, but are not limited to: yard trimmings, 1 2 grass, weeds, leaves, prunings, branches, dead plants, brush, tree trimmings, dead trees, small 3 wood pieces and other types of organic vard waste. Green materials excludes food scraps and 4 paper contaminated with food scraps. 5 Designated organic recyclable materials (or "organic recyclable materials") means materials that are required to be separated from solid waste and designated recyclable materials prior 6 7 to disposal and returned for use or reuse in the form of raw materials for new, used or 8 reconstituted products. Organic recyclable materials include, but are not limited to: yard 9 trimmings and food scraps such as green trimmings, grass, weeds, leaves, prunings, 10 branches, dead plants, brush, tree trimmings, dead trees, small wood pieces, other types of 11 organic yard waste, vegetable waste, fruit waste, dairy waste, meat waste, fish waste, and paper contaminated with food scraps. The term "organic recyclable materials" solely means 12 "designated green materials" when referencing multifamily residential property 13 14 requirements. 15 Designated recyclable materials (or "recyclable materials") means materials that are 16 required to be separated from solid waste and designated organic recyclable materials 17 prior to disposal and returned for use or reuse in the form of raw materials for new, used 18 or reconstituted products. Recyclable materials include, but are not limited to: cardboard, 19 paper, plastic, scrap metal, beverage containers, and clean (untreated and unpainted) wood. 20 *Garbage* means a form of solid waste which is putrescible animal, fish, fowl, food, fruit or vegetable 21 matter resulting from the cultivation, preparation, storage, handling, decay or consumption of such 22 substance. 23 Hazardous waste means a waste, or combination of wastes, which because of its quantity, 24 concentration or physical, chemical or infectious characteristics may do either of the following: 25 1. Cause, or significantly contribute to, an increase in mortality or an increase in serious 26 irreversible or incapacitating reversible illness. 27 2. Pose a substantial present or potential hazard to human health or environment when 28 improperly treated, stored, transported or disposed of or otherwise managed.

1	Manual container means a metal, plastic or rubber container, 20- to 32-gallon capacity,
2	provided by the resident in City designated areas where automated collection service is not
3	possible. Said containers are not to exceed a weight of 15 pounds when empty, and must have
4	side bail handles and a tight-fitting lid, designed and manufactured for the accumulation and
5	storage of solid waste, or plastic and/or paper bags manufactured for the accumulation and
6	storage of refuse. The top diameter of the container shall in no case be smaller than the
7	diameter of the receptacle at the bottom.
8	Person means an individual, firm, limited liability company, association, partnership,
9	industry, public or private corporation, or any other entity whatsoever.
10	Place or premises means every dwelling house, dwelling unit; apartment house or multiple-
11	dwelling building with less than 5 units; and every other place or premises where any person
12	resides within the City.
13	Place or premises means every dwelling house, dwelling unit; apartment house or multiple-dwelling
14	building; trailer or mobile home park; store; restaurant; rooming house; hotel; motel; office building;
15	department store; manufacturing, processing or assembling shop or plant; and every other place or
16	premises where any person resides, or any business is carried on or conducted within the City.
17	Public Works Director means the Public Works Director of the City or his or her duly authorized
18	representative.
19	Refuse means solid waste.
20	<i>Recyclable</i> means any paper, glass, cardboard, plastic, used motor oil, ferrous metal, aluminum, or
21	any item or material that has been separated from solid waste, and has an economic value, and is
22	deposited in a recyclable material receptacle provided by the City or in a privately owned receptacle
23	on which the City's official sticker is placed designating said receptacle to be recyclable material for
24	the City to collect.
25	<u>Recycling means the process of collecting, sorting, cleansing, treating and reconstituting</u>
26	materials that would otherwise become solid waste and returning them for use or reuse in
27	the form of raw materials for new, used or reconstituted products which meet the quality
28	standard necessary to be used in the marketplace. Recycling does not include
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 transformation as defined in Section 40201 of the California Public Resources Code. The

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 term "recycling" may be used to include source separated materials.

Rubbish means a form of solid waste which is nonputrescible, useless, unused, unwanted or
discarded material or debris, either combustible or noncombustible, including but not limited to
paper, cardboard, grass, tree or shrub trimmings, straw, clothing, wood or wood products, crockery,
glass, rubber, metal, plastic, construction material, and similar material.

<u>SB 1383 means Senate Bill 1383 (Lara, Chapter 395, Statutes of 2016) also commonly</u> referred to as "SB 1383", as amended, supplemented, superseded, and replaced from time to time.

SB 1383 Regulations means Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, Division 7, Chapter 12: Short-lived Climate Pollutants, beginning with section 18981.1, as amended, supplemented, superseded and replaced from time to time.

13 Solid waste means all putrescible and nonputrescible solid, semisolid, and liquid wastes, including 14 garbage, trash, refuse, paper, rubbish, ashes, industrial wastes, demolition and construction wastes, 15 discarded home and industrial appliances, dewatered, treated or chemically fixed sewage sludge 16 which is not hazardous waste, manure, vegetable or animal solid and semi-solid wastes, and other discarded solid and semi-solid wastes. Solid waste does not include hazardous waste or low-level 17 18 radioactive waste regulated under Chapter 7.6 (commencing with Section 25800) of Division 20 19 of the California Health and Safety Code or medical waste. Solid waste does not include 20 recyclable materials or organic recyclable materials set out for separate collection for the 21 purposes of recycling and that are not landfilled. Solid waste does include recyclable material. 22 Solid waste includes dirt, soil, rock, decomposed rock, gravel, sand, or other aggregate material. 23 Solid Waste Collector means personnel employed by the City or contractors for the collection and 24 disposal of solid waste. 25 *Source separate* or *source separated* means the process of removing recyclable materials and/or

26 organic recyclable materials, from solid waste for the purpose of recycling and/or organics 27 recycling.

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Standard automated container means a 96 gallon container provided by the City for collection of solid waste or organic recyclable material or recyclable material.

Standard container means a metal, plastic or rubber container, 20 to 32 gallon capacity, not to 4 exceed a weight of 15 pounds when empty, with side bail handles and a tight fitting lid, designed 5 and manufactured for the accumulation and storage of solid waste, or plastic and/or paper bags manufactured for the accumulation and storage of refuse. The top diameter of the container shall in 6 7 no case be smaller than the diameter of the receptacle at the bottom."

> Section 3: Section 6.04.020 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.020 Receptacle requirements.

10 A. Every owner, tenant, lessee or occupant of any premises where solid waste is generated shall keep upon the premises sufficient standard automated containers for receiving and holding 12 all solid waste generated between the times of removal. Where a property is served by 13 manual service, the owner, tenant, lessee, or occupant of such property shall provide 14 sufficient manual containers for receiving and holding all solid waste generated 15 between times of removal. All solid waste on the premises shall be kept in said containers. 16 <u>B.</u> Every owner, operator, manager or person in charge of any hotel, restaurant, cafe, cafeteria, hospital, public dining room or other place where food is prepared for sale, sold or offered 18 for sale for human consumption and every owner, operator, manager or person in charge of 19 any store, market or other place where meat, fish, fowl, vegetables, fruit or any food is sold 20 or offered for human consumption shall provide a separate standard container for receiving and holding all garbage created upon the premises between the times of collection; provided, 22 however, the garbage may be placed in the same receptacles as rubbish if the garbage is 23 drained and securely wrapped or sealed in plastic bags prior to placement in the container or bin.

CB. Solid waste containers shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. It is unlawful for any person to use solid waste containers that do not conform to the provisions of this chapter or that may have ragged or sharp edges or any other defect liable to hamper or injure the person collecting the contents thereof. If, within five days after written notice of a violation

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1	of this section from the Public Works Director, such container is not repaired or replaced as
2	necessary, further service for the container may be suspended until the violation is corrected.
3	Where the container was provided by the City, the City may replace the container and
4	<u>charge the cost for the replacement to the customer's account, except where the damage</u>
5	was due to normal wear and tear of the container. The notice of violation shall be deemed
6	served when securely attached to the container determined not in conformance with the
7	provisions of this section. The customer may appeal the notice of violation to the Public
8	Works Director within 10 days of service of notice. The Public Works Director's
9	decision shall be final.
10	<u>C.</u> Each property shall have separate containers for the collection of solid waste, recyclable
11	materials, and organic recyclable materials. Properties serviced by automated service
12	shall have no more than one standard automated container each for solid waste,
13	recyclable materials, and organic recyclable materials, except where the customer has
14	made arrangements with the City or Contractor for an additional container. Properties
15	serviced by manual service shall have no more than three manual containers each for
16	solid waste, recyclable materials, and organic recyclable materials.
17	D. Whether a property is serviced through automated or manual service shall be
18	determined in the sole discretion of the Public Works Director, or designee."
19	Section 4: Section 6.04.030 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:
20	"6.04.030 Location of containers and placement for collection service
21	A. At residential property serviced by the City or by a Contractor, standard automated or
22	manual containers shall be placed as follows for collection:
23	1. Residential customers adjoining an alley shall place their standard automated or
24	manual containers adjacent to but not within the alley.
25	2. Residential customers shall place their standard automated or manual
26	containers at the City curb immediately adjacent to the serviced property.
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1		2. Residential customers may utilize one of three levels of collection service. Fees for
2		different levels of service are set by resolution. In special circumstances the Public
3		Works Director, or designee, may designate receptacle location.
4		a. Curbside: Receptacle shall be placed at the curbside or adjacent to the alley
5		before 5:30 a.m. on collection days. Sidewalks shall not be blocked.
6		b. Driveway: Receptacles shall be placed adjacent to the driveway before 5:30
7		a.m. on collection days. Driveway clearance must be sufficient to
8		accommodate collection equipment.
9		c. Backyard: Receptacles are located behind gates, inside trash enclosures,
10		beside garages not accessible for collection equipment in any location not in
11		accordance with curbside or driveway levels.
12		3. In special circumstances the Public Works Director, or designee, may designate
13		receptacle location.
14		3. Residential customers who place their standard containers at the City curb shall not
15		do so earlier than 6:00 p.m. of the day preceding such collection nor fail to remove
16		the container from the curb prior to 8:00 p.m. of the day of collection.
17	<u>B.</u>	Residential customers serviced by a Contractor shall place their standard automated or
18		manual containers at the curb immediately adjacent to the serviced property for
19		collection, except when other arrangements have been made with the collection
20		<u>contractor.</u>
21	<u>C.</u>	Standard automated and manual containers shall not be placed in the designated
22		location for collection prior to 6:00 p.m. on the day preceding collection service and
23		shall be removed from the designated location no later than 8:00 p.m. on the day of
24		<u>collection.</u>
25	B.	At residential properties serviced by contractors, the residents shall place their standard
26		containers at the curb for collection except when other arrangements have been made with
27		the collection contractor. Containers shall be removed from the curb except between the
28		hours of 6:00 p.m. on the day preceding such collection and 8:00 p.m. on the day of
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1		collection. Detachable bins provided by the contractor shall be placed where they are
2		accessible to the contractor's collection vehicle.
3	C	For commercial collection all standard containers and detachable bins shall be placed at an
4		area designated by the contractor.
5	D.	In all disputes, complaints or problems arising from or concerning the location of containers
6		or bins, the Public Works Director shall designate the proper location and the decision of the
7		Public Works Director shall be final."
8		Section 5: Section 6.04.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:
9	"6.04	.040 Placement of material in receptacles.
10	<u>A.</u>	At residential properties, the Public Works Director shall designate the manner in
11		which material shall be placed in containers for collection, including but not limited to
12		the types of materials to be placed in solid waste, recycling, and green waste or organic
13		recyclable containers and the manner in which materials shall be separated, contained,
14		or broken down prior to placement in containers.
15	<u>B.</u>	When filled, the manual container shall not weigh more than 55 pounds. When filled,
16		the standard automated container shall not weigh more than 150 pounds.
17	<u>C.</u>	The Public Works Director may designate materials eligible for special pickup as bulky
18		items and the time, frequency, and volume of bulky item collection service. Acceptable
19		materials shall be placed at the curb immediately adjacent to the serviced property no
20		earlier than 4:00 p.m. on the day before the scheduled bulky item service. City or
21		Contractor's may refuse collection if items exceed limitations or otherwise do not
22		conform to the established bulky item service requirements.
23	<u>D.</u>	Placement of solid waste into containers designated for recyclable or organic recyclable
24		material is prohibited. The Public Works Director, or designee, shall enforce excessive
25		contamination of recycling and organic recycling containers. For the purposes of this
26		section, excessive contamination shall mean more than two (2) percent by volume of
27		nonacceptable materials.
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1	<u>1.</u> If a collector finds that a recycling or organic recycling container has been
2	excessively contaminated by solid waste, the collector must leave a tag on the
3	container notifying the customer of the violation and identifying the incorrect
4	materials. The collector may refuse to empty the container until the incorrect
5	materials have been removed, except that a collector shall not refuse to empty a
6	container from a multifamily property where multiple occupants share
7	<u>collection service.</u>
8	2. If after a collector identifies excessive contamination and issues notices of
9	violation for three (3) consecutive collection dates , a residential customer
10	<u>continues to excessively contaminate recycling and/or organic recycling</u>
11	containers, a fee equal to the charge for an additional solid waste disposal
12	container shall be charged to the customer's account. The Public Works
13	Director shall provide notice of the fee to the customer at least 10 days prior to
14	the fee appearing the customer's bill. Notice of the fee shall be deemed served
15	when placed in the mail to the customer at the last known address listed on the
16	account. The customer may appeal the assessment of the fee to the Public
17	Works Director within 10 days of service of notice. The Public Works Director's
18	decision shall be final.
19	A. At residential properties the following shall govern the placement of material in receptacles
20	for collection:
21	1. Wooden boxes, crates and cardboard or paper boxes or cartons shall be broken and
22	flattened before being placed in a receptacle or tied in a bundle no more than 18
23	inches in diameter and four feet in length and placed beside the standard container.
24	2. Vacuum dust, sweepings and ashes shall be securely wrapped or enclosed in a bag
25	prior to placement in the standard container.
26	3. Household garbage shall be drained and wrapped in paper or secured in plastic bags
27	prior to placement in the standard container.
28	4. Animal waste of household pets shall be wrapped.
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1	5. Sharp edged and pointed material such as glass and metal shall be packaged before
2	placement in the receptacle in such a way as to protect refuse handlers from being cut
3	or wounded when handling the receptacles and contents with ordinary care.
4	6. Tree trimmings shall be tied in bundles not more than 18 inches in diameter nor more
5	than four feet in length and shall include branches and logs no more than three inches
6	in diameter or shall be cut in short lengths and placed in the standard containers. In
7	areas serviced by the City, bundled tree trimmings shall be collected on the second
8	regular collection day of each week; namely, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.
9	7. When filled, the standard container shall not weigh more than 55 pounds.
10	B. At commercial properties, placement of material in receptacles for collection shall be as
11	follows:
12	1. All refuse must be placed in standard containers or detachable bins.
13	2. Garbage must be drained and securely wrapped or sealed in plastic bags prior to
14	placement in containers or bins."
15	Section 6: Section 6.04.050 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:
16	"6.04.050 Required solid waste removal.
17	A. No person, persons, firm or corporation other than one of the City authorized solid waste
18	haulers acting pursuant to their contract with the City, municipal solid waste collection crews
19	or a person or firm acting under the authority and within the limitation of a valid self-hauler
20	permit issued pursuant to this chapter, shall collect solid waste, recyclable or organic
21	recyclable materials within the City.
22	B. No person, persons, firm or corporation other than the City or one of the City-authorized
23	solid waste contractors acting pursuant to their contract with the City shall provide temporary
24	bin service for solid waste, recyclable or organic recyclable material.
25	C. Except as provided in subdivision D of this section, solid waste collection shall be provided
26	from residential property at a minimum of once a week.
27	D. Commercial solid waste collection shall be provided not less than once a week except that at
28	each business engaged in the sale or production of food and at each multifamily residential
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property which receives bin service, such collection shall be provided not less than twice weekly. "Multifamily residential property" includes but is not limited to apartment house, boarding house, rooming house, town house and condominium.

ED. Every owner, lessee, tenant or occupant of residential or commercial property shall remove or cause to be removed all solid waste created, produced or brought upon the premises according to the schedule in B or C-this section by subscribing to the solid waste collection service of the City or the contractor authorized by the City Council to provide such service to that property; provided, however, one may provide one's own service pursuant to a selfhauler permit as provided in this chapter for the removal of solid waste created by one's own activity as a residential or commercial occupant, but not as a landlord for one's tenant or lessee."

<u>Section 7</u>: Section 6.04.055 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.055 Requirements for <u>residential</u> self-haulers.

- A. Every occupant of a residential or commercial property desiring to provide removal of solid waste, recyclable material, and organic recyclable material created by their own activity shall first obtain and maintain in full force and effect a self-hauler permit and shall provide solid waste removal service in accordance with said self-hauler permit.
- 18 B. Application for self-hauler permits shall be made to the Public Works Director and shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable fee set by resolution.
- C. The Public Works Director shall issue the permit upon determining that the applicant is able
 to transport all solid waste <u>and recyclable and organic recyclable materials in</u> a safe and
 sanitary manner in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

D. Such permit shall be effective for one year from the date of its issue expire at the end of the fiscal year in which it is issued.

E. If the application is denied by the Public Works Director, the applicant shall be provided with a full statement of the reasons for the denial.

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- F. A permit may be revoked by the Public Works Director for any violation of law or for failure to comply with the provisions of this chapter by providing the permittee with a written statement of the violations noted.
- G. A denial or revocation may be appealed to the Public Safety Committee of the City Council whose decision shall be final. Such appeal shall be filed with the City Clerk within ten days after the receipt of the Public Works Director's written notice of denial or revocation.
- H. All solid waste removal pursuant to a valid self-hauler's permit shall be accomplished by the permit holder or the holder's own employees using the permittee's own equipment.
- I.All solid waste removed pursuant to a self-hauler permit shall be deposited only at
authorized, licensed, and permitted solid waste disposal sites.
Recyclable materials and
organic recyclable materials shall be hauled to a solid waste facility, operation, activity,
or property that processes or recovers such source separated materials.
- 13 J. All equipment used by a self-hauler's permittee to remove solid waste shall comply with the
 requirements of Section 6.04.060.
- 15 K. Every holder of a self-hauler permit shall submit legible copies of landfill disposal receipts
 16 to the Public Works Director on or before the tenth of each month for solid waste deposits
 17 made during the previous month at authorized and licensed solid waste disposal sites."

Section 8: Section 6.04.060 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.060 Vehicle requirements for conveyance of solid waste.

- A. Passenger motor vehicles shall not be used in the transportation of solid waste, recyclable or organic recyclable material upon or along any public street or highway of the City; provided, however, residential self-haulers as provided in Section 6.04.055 may utilize such vehicles upon the condition that the solid waste, recyclable or organic recyclable material is so contained as to prevent it from leaking, dripping, falling, blowing or scattering from the vehicle in which it is being conveyed or transported.
- B. Trucks used in the collection and transportation of solid waste, <u>recyclable or organic</u>
 <u>recyclable material</u> shall have bodies of watertight metal construction which shall be
 leakproof and shall be equipped with a close-fitting cover, which shall be affixed in a manner

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that will prevent dropping, spilling or other loss of solid waste upon the highway during collection and transportation. In lieu of such watertight bodies and covers, separate metal containers with tight-fitting, clamp-on lids may be used.

- C. Trucks used in the collection of rubbish shall have solid construction of the floor and body and shall be equipped with a close-fitting covering which shall be affixed in a manner that will prevent the dropping or blowing of any rubbish upon the highway during collection and transportation.
- D. All trucks used in the collection and transportation of solid waste, recyclable or organic
 recyclable material and rubbish shall be maintained in a clean, sanitary and neatly painted
 condition, and shall carry a shovel, broom, first-aid kit and fire extinguisher.
- E. Every contractor authorized by the City Council to collect solid waste, recyclable or organic
 recyclable material shall paint his firm name and telephone number in legible letters not less
 than three inches in height on both sides of all trucks used to collect and transport refuse."
 Section 9: Section 6.04.070 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.070 Collection periods.

- A. Solid waste collection from residential properties shall be provided by all haulers a minimum of once a week.
- B. Contractors shall provide collection service to all commercial premises at least once a week; provided, however, collection must be made at least twice a week to those establishments generating garbage; and further provided that nothing in this subsection shall prohibit the contractor from collecting solid waste at a more frequent rate.
 - **<u>B</u>C**. Solid waste will not be collected on Sundays except in emergencies and as approved by the Public Works Director.

<u>C</u>Đ. Solid waste collection within or in close proximity to residential areas shall not commence prior to 5:30 a.m. on any day."

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Section 10: Section 6.04.090 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.090 Unsightly solid waste deemed nuisance.

Solid waste, recyclable or organic recyclable material, which by reason of its location and character is unsightly and interferes with the reasonable enjoyment of property by neighbors, is a public nuisance within the meaning and subject to the provisions of this Code."

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Section 11: Section 6.04.100 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.100 Property owner alley clearance duties.

No person owning, leasing or occupying property adjoining any public alley in the City shall fail, refuse or neglect to keep that portion of such alley between the centerline thereof and the property line of such property free from solid waste, recyclable or organic recyclable material."

Section 12: Section 6.04.130 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.130 Accumulation of waste matter restricted.

No person owning or occupying any building, lot or premises in the City shall suffer, allow or permit to collect and remain upon such lot or premises any solid waste<u>, recyclable or organic recyclable</u> <u>material</u>; provided, however, that this provision shall not be construed as interfering with building under a building permit, or wood neatly piled for kitchen or household use."

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Section 13: Section 6.04.140 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.140 Restraint of animals to protect collectors.

Any occupant owning or possessing an animal on the premises which may bite or attempt to bite a solid waste hauler while engaged in collecting refuse shall be required to secure the animal(s) or place the receptacles in such manner that such animal shall not constitute a hazard or to endanger a solid waste hauler. In addition to any criminal penalties specified in this Code, failure to adhere to the requirements of this section shall be cause for suspension of collection service during such time as there exists any such danger or hazard. Suspension of service pursuant to this section shall not relieve any person or firm of the duty to pay solid waste collection charges during such period of suspension."

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Section 14: Section 6.04.150 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.150 Regulation-making powers.

The Public Works Director is authorized to make such rules and regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter so as to effect efficient collection and removal of <u>solid</u> waste, <u>recyclable</u> <u>material</u>, <u>and organic recyclable</u> material by the City or its duly authorized contractors."

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Section 15: Section 6.04.160 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

"6.04.160 Collection areas.

For purposes of defining the areas of the City in which the City's contractors will operate and in which areas City personnel will collect residential solid waste, a map of the City is on file in the office of the City Clerk. Five-areas are identified thereon. The type of service: residential or commercial; exclusive or non-exclusive; City personnel or contractor; are identified in the contracts with City's contract solid waste collectors. Upon a determination by the Public Works Department and at the direction of the Public Works Director that good cause exists or that an annexation has been completed, that map may be modified."

Section 16: Section 6.04.180 of the Riverside Municipal Code is amended as follows:

16 "6.

"6.04.180 Inspection of premises—chapter enforcement.

A. The duly authorized representative of the Health Officer or Public Works Director shall visit all premises within the City from time to time to examine the sanitary conditions of the premises to determine whether the provisions of this chapter and state laws are being complied with. The Public Works Director shall enforce the provisions of this chapter and properly notify any owner or occupant of any violations of this chapter. Such notice whenever possible shall be affixed to a receptacle or delivered in person.

B. SB 1383 Regulatory Compliance. Organic waste generators, including commercial and multi-family covered generators, haulers and all other entities subject to the requirements of SB 1383 shall fully comply with all applicable SB 1383 regulatory requirements or be subject to the penalties as prescribed in section 18997.2 of the SB 1383 Regulations."
