

B10. Significance (confinued):
The building appears eligible for the National Register and the California Register for individual significance under Criterion A and Criterion C at the local level; it does not appear to be within any potential historic district.

A building permit was issued for a citruo packing house at 3230 Vine Street on 27 September 1923 at a cost of \$36,000. The Creamer Manufacturing Co. a prominent local firm was contracted by the Union Pacific Railroad to build this industrial building. Construction of this modern packing house was part of a building program undertaken by the Union Pacific in Riverside railroad industrial building were planned. In addition to the packing house, new railroad spura, remodeling of another packing house,

and construction of other industrial building were planned.

The building was constructed north of the E.T. Wall Grower and Shipper building (1921) at 3280 Vine

The building was constructed north of the R.T. Wall Grower and Shipper building (1921) at 3280 vine Street. The Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad, which was commissioned by and controlled jointly by the union Pacific Railroad and the Oregon Short Line Railroad. Both 3230 and 3280 Vine Street were on the same parcel prior to a lot split, d. 1950's-1970's. According to the Riverside City Directory (1920-1951), E.T. Wall Grower and Shipper is listed at 3230 Vine Street with Arthur McDermont until the early 1940's. After that date E.T. Wall Grower and shipper is the only occupant listed. E. T. Wall was a prominent Riverside citrus grower and businessman. Wall's first groves were in the Victoria District in 1906. By 1937 Wall had 200 acres in citrus, mostly mayal. He also had an 800-acre ranch near Kingsburg (Fresno County). According to The Riverside mostly naval, He also had an 800 acre ranch near Kingsburg (Fresho County). According to The Riverside

Central Library newspaper index, wall dies in 1953.

From 1944 to 1956, the Riverside City Directories list the 2 huildings of E.T. Wall Grover and Shipper 13230 and 3260 Vine Street at one address - 3230 Vine Street. Today, the building at 3230 Vine street is still owned by the B.T. Wall Company, but is not used for citrus processing. The building is used

The Cresmer Manufacturing Company was one of the most prominent building firs in the Riverside area. Among their major projects they constructed the Riverside Abstract Company and the Riverside Congregational Church as well as many other residential, school, and industrial buildings (c. 1910-1020s). According to building records, the Cresmer manufacturing Company constructed the packing houses at 3280 vine Street (1921), which was originally part of the same property owned by the Union Pacific Railroad, Builder/contractor Rainey McLasc constructed to cull bin (1932) on the (W) elevation of the macking house at 3230 Vine Street (1932) for Union Pacific Railroad's subsidiary. The This building was designed with modern and up-to-date specifications for citrus packing houses. The wood truss saw-tooth roof was supported internally by a minimal number of wood posts. The saw-tooth roof system provided a number of large windows, facing north to furnish indirect and diffused light to the work area. Examples of this type of toof were initially features in the California Citrograph; C. 1919. By the min-1920's it was used frequently in the design of citrus packing houses. The first floor of the citrus packing houses was used to sort and pack oranges and to house the administrative offices. The basement area raised the main floor of the building to a height compatible for loading boxes of oranges onto railroad (1932) was used to store juice grade fruit for shipment to processing plants in the area.

The E.T. Wall Grower and Shipper Packing House appears eligible for the national Register under The E.T. Wall Grover and snipper racking house appears eligible for the national negigier three. Criterion A (citrus industry) at the local level of significance. The building represent a distinct and important example of the relationship between the citrus industry and railroad transportation in times of the economic development patterns in Riverside during the 1920's. The railroad owned the land and funded the construction of the packing house, which was utilized by the E.T. Wall Company for the processing of citrus for shipment to markets all over the county by the Union Pacific Railroad. Other packing houses built in Riverside during the 1920's were developed in a more typical way with funds provided by individuals or citrus cooperatives, such as the extant McDermont Packing House (1923) at 3141 Ninth Street. This packing house was constructed also by Cresmer manufacturing Company, utilizing the wood truss, saw-tooth roof design and the Mission Revival architectural style for its facade. It was funded by the Riverside Naval Growers Association.

The building at 3230 Vine Street also appears eligible for the national Register under Criterion C (industrial architecture) at the local level of significance. This Mission Revival industrial building and its use as a citrus packing house represents an important type, period, and method of construction found in Riverside and elsewhere in southern California during the 1920s. It was during this period that the first generation of citrus packing houses, built in the late 19th-early 20th centuries, began to be replaced by more modern, efficient buildings. The design utilized the wood truss, saw-tooth roof, which met the needs of an industrial citrus processing building by accommodating more machinery in the workspace and providing improved natural lighting. The building at 1230 Vine Street in one of a few known packing houses in Riverside that has this roof type.

Two other extant examples of this roof type are the packing houses at 3280 Vine Street (1921), which is in the project area and proviously determined to be incligible for the National Register in 1997;

and the packing house at 3141 Ninth Street. The building at 3230 Vine Street also represents the characteristic use of a reinforced concrete frame with hollow tile as in-fill for citrus-related industrial buildings, which provided fireproof and insulating features. The continued prominence of California's Hispanic architectural tradition (e.g., the mission revival), and its particular association with the citrus industry, is clearly conveyed by the design of this industrial building as wall.

The building at 3230 Vine Street does not appear eligible for the National Register under Criterion D. because there is no known association with the life of a person, significant in the past. The building retains a fairly high degree of historic integrity from its period of significance [1923], conveyed through the contributing aspects of location, design, materials, and workmenship, feeling, and association. However, the setting has been diminished by the to removal of the railroad spur lines; and the addition of 2 detached storage buildings in the 1970s. The setting outside of the property boundary has been diminished as well by the alterations of the neighboring citrus-related
