Pedestrian Target Safeguarding

- Ensure public areas are safe, secure, functional and visually appealing
- Prevent Vehicular Attacks
- Reduce accidental collision

Active Transportation

- Improve connections for biking and walking
- Prioritize needed improvements
- Identify strategy for constructing improvements

Complete Streets Ordinance

- Create design standards
- Communicate development expectations
- Allows physical improvements to be included in new projects

Trails Master Plan

- Create a connected urban and rural trail system
- Evidence the quality of life through recreation and activity
- Invest and expand trails in the future

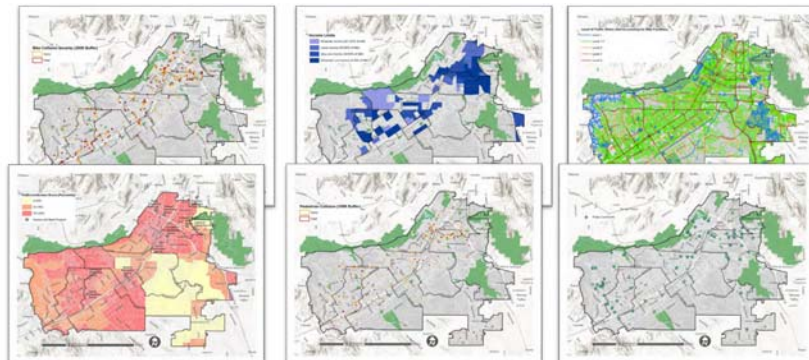

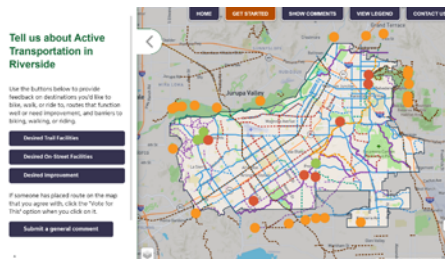

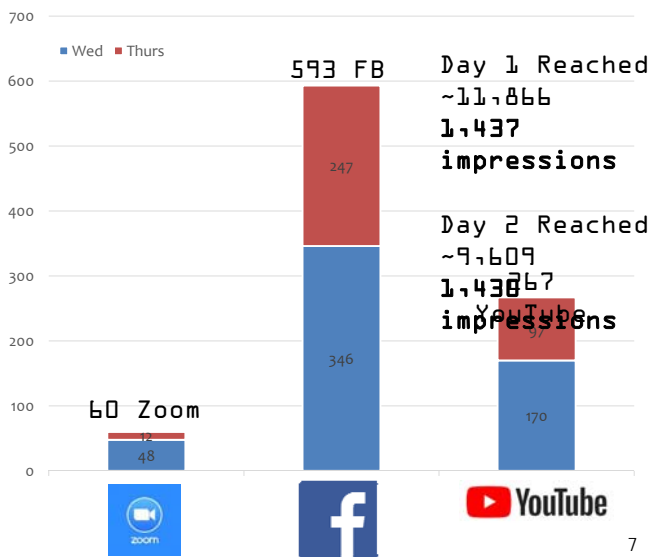

ENGAGEMENT KEY FINDINGS

1. Missing / poor sidewalk conditions
2. Safety for pedestrians and bicyclists from vehicles
3. Bike lanes must connect to key destinations
4. Lack of bike lanes
5. Safe street crossings for students
6. Transit access



ENGAGEMENT KEY FINDINGS

- 7. Infrastructure must accommodate impaired residents
- 8. Concerns with homelessness
- 9. Specific street & neighborhood issues
- 10. Shade to protect from sun / heat
- 11. Poor bike lane striping
- 12. Trash in roads
