

1 RESOLUTION NO. ____

2 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
3 RIVERSIDE, CALIFORNIA APPROVING APPLICATION FOR
4 PER CAPITA GRANT FUNDS.

5 WHEREAS, the California Department of Parks and Recreation has been delegated the
6 responsibility by the Legislature of the State of California for the administration of the Per Capita
7 Grant Program, setting up necessary procedures governing application(s); and

8 WHEREAS, said procedures established by the California Department of Parks and
9 Recreation require the grantee's Governing Body to certify by resolution the approval of project
10 application(s) before submission of said applications to the State; and

11 WHEREAS, the City of Riverside will enter into a contract(s) with the State of California to
12 complete project(s).

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Riverside, as
14 follows:

15 Section 1. The City of Riverside is approved to file project application(s) for Per Capita
16 program grant project(s).

17 Section 2. The City of Riverside certifies that it has or will have available, prior to
18 commencement of project work utilizing Per Capita funding, sufficient funds to complete the
19 project(s).

20 Section 3. The City of Riverside certifies that it has or will have sufficient funds to
21 operate and maintain the project(s).

22 Section 4. The City of Riverside certifies that all projects proposed will be consistent
23 with the park and recreation element of the City's general or recreation plan (PRC §80063(a)).

24 Section 5. The City of Riverside certifies that these funds will be used to supplement, not
25 supplant, local revenues in existence as of June 5, 2018 (PRC §80062(d)).

26 Section 6. The City of Riverside certifies that it will comply with the provisions of
27 §1771.5 of the State Labor Code.

28 Section 7: (PRC §80001(b)(8)(A-G)) To the extent practicable, as identified in the
"Presidential Memorandum--Promoting Diversity and Inclusion in Our National Parks, National

1 Forests, and Other Public Lands and Waters,” dated January 12, 2017, the City of Riverside will
2 consider a range of actions that include, but are not limited to, the following:

3 (A) Conducting active outreach to diverse populations, particularly minority, low-
4 income, and disabled populations and tribal communities, to increase awareness within those
5 communities and the public generally about specific programs and opportunities.

6 (B) Mentoring new environmental, outdoor recreation, and conservation leaders to
7 increase diverse representation across these areas.

8 (C) Creating new partnerships with state, local, tribal, private, and nonprofit
9 organizations to expand access for diverse populations.

10 (D) Identifying and implementing improvements to existing programs to increase
11 visitation and access by diverse populations, particularly minority, low-income, and disabled
12 populations and tribal communities.

13 (E) Expanding the use of multilingual and culturally appropriate materials in
14 public communications and educational strategies, including through social media strategies,
15 as appropriate, that target diverse populations.

16 (F) Developing or expanding coordinated efforts to promote youth engagement
17 and empowerment, including fostering new partnerships with diversity-serving and youth-
18 serving organizations, urban areas, and programs.

19 (G) Identifying possible staff liaisons to diverse populations.

20 Section 8: The City of Riverside agrees that to the extent practicable, the project(s) will
21 provide workforce education and training, contractor and job opportunities for disadvantaged
22 communities (PRC §80001(b)(5)).

23 Section 9: The City of Riverside certifies that it shall not reduce the amount of funding
24 otherwise available to be spent on parks or other projects eligible for funds under this division in its
25 jurisdiction. A one-time allocation of other funding that has been expended for parks or other
26 projects, but which is not available on an ongoing basis, shall not be considered when calculating a
27 recipient’s annual expenditures. (PRC §80062(d)).

Section 10: The City of Riverside certifies that it has reviewed, understands, and agrees to the General Provisions contained in the contract shown in the Procedural Guide.

Section 11: The City of Riverside delegates the authority to the City Manager, or his or her designee, to conduct all negotiations, sign and submit all documents, including, but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, and payment requests, which may be necessary for the completion of the grant scope(s).
