BACKGROUND:

The Airport Manager's Operation and Activity Report is provided to inform the Airport Commission (Commission) about operations, City Council actions, events, meetings and other issues concerning the Riverside Municipal Airport (Airport).

This update includes information about Airport operations, financials, activities, events, and investment in infrastructure.

Recent City Council and Committee Actions:

There were no City Council or Committee actions taken since the last report.

Upcoming City Council and Committee Actions:

City Council approval is anticipated in late December 2020 for the First Option to Extend Lease for the Commemorative Air Force. This extension is for five (5) years, effective January 1, 2021.

Other activities and events

The construction project for the pavement rehabilitation of the Port-a-Port aircraft tie-downs is complete. The project came in ahead of schedule, with a target completion date of November 5, and on budget at \$397,013. This project was paid for entirely from Airport revenues.

The federal grant projects to install an emergency generator for airfield lighting and to relocate the Runway 16/34 windsock is on schedule. The contractor is waiting for delivery of the generator. This project is fully funded by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), at a cost of approximately \$350,000. In early 2020, the federal government determined that due to financial conditions created by COVID-19, the FAA would pay 100% of approved grant projects versus the normal 10% cost share by the Airport and State grant funds.

The Airport will be meeting with the FAA in December to discuss the next five-year Airport Capital Improvement Program project list. See Attachment 1.

On September 16, 2020, the Airport participated in the annual Runway Safety Action Team meeting hosted by the FAA. This meeting discusses events involving vehicles, persons or aircraft that entered the runway environment without prior approval from the air traffic control tower, referred to as "runway incursions." These types of events are potential hazards to aircraft. During the last three years, the Airport has experienced three runway incursions. Two of the events were the result of homeless individuals climbing the perimeter fence and walking across the runway, and the third event involved a tenant crossing a runway without prior air traffic control permission. Riverside Police were contacted for the events involving the homeless individuals and conducted the appropriate follow-up; the Airport tenant event was addressed by Airport staff and the tenant, requiring additional training and orientation on how to safely move about the airfield. The FAA commended Riverside Municipal Airport for maintaining an overall safe environment for aircraft and the general public, since the national average for these types of events is 5-6 per month at general aviation airports.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact associated with receiving this monthly activity report.
