MEASURE Z - JOINT ITEM WITH HOUSING AUTHORITY - DISPOSITION AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT - 2550 FOURTEENTH

Hearing was called in accordance with California Health and Safety Code Section 34312.3 to consider a Disposition and Development Agreement with Path of Life Ministries, Inc., for sale of Housing Authority property located at 2550 Fourteenth Street for \$1 to develop a single-family home and an accessory dwelling unit and an Agreement for the Payment of Development and Regional Impact Fees for the Construction of Permanent Supportive Housing to provide \$60,000 of Measure Z funds to cover impact fees. Four people spoke on the matter. The public hearing was officially closed. Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Melendrez and seconded by Councilmember Edwards that the Housing Authority (1) approve a Disposition and Development Agreement with Path of Life Ministries, Inc., for sale of Housing Authority property located at 2550 Fourteenth Street for \$1 for development of a single-family cottage home and an accessory dwelling unit; and (2) authorize the Executive Director, or his designee, to execute the Disposition and Development Agreement with Path of Life Ministries, Inc., including making minor and non-substantive changes. The motion carried with Councilmembers Edwards, Melendrez, Fierro, Perry, and Hemenway, Councilwoman Plascencia voting aye and Councilmember Conder voting no.

Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Melendrez and seconded by Councilmember Edwards that the City Council (1) approve an Agreement for the Payment of Development and Regional Impact Fees for the Construction of Permanent Supportive Housing with Path of Life Ministries to provide \$60,000 of Measure Z funds to cover impact fees; (2) authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Agreement for the Payment of Development and Regional Impact Fees for the Construction of Permanent Supportive Housing with Path of Life Ministries, Inc., including make non-substantive changes; and (3) authorize expenditure of up to \$60,000 from Measure Z Fund CD-Homeless Services Professional Services Account No. 8002001-421000 to cover impact fees related to development of a single-family home and accessory dwelling unit located at 2550 Fourteenth Street. 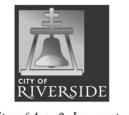

Hearing was called in accordance with California Health and Safety Code Section 34312.3 to consider a Disposition and Development Agreement with The Aspire, LP for sale of Housing Authority property located at 3855-3893 Third Street for \$1, a Permanent Local Housing Allocation Loan Agreement for a loan amount of \$541,019 to facilitate construction of The Aspire Project, a 33-unit affordable housing community dedicated to termed-out foster youth and homeless youth, and a Resolution supporting The Aspire Project and supporting The Aspire, LP's funding applications to the California Department of Housing and Community Development, the California Tax Credit Allocation Committee, and the City for up to \$459,981 in HOME Investment Partnerships Act funds. No one spoke on the matter. The public hearing was officially closed. Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Edwards and seconded by Councilmember Perry that the Housing Authority (1) approve a Disposition and Development Agreement with The Aspire, LP for sale of Housing Authority property located at 3855-3893 Third Street for \$1 to facilitate construction of The Aspire Project, a 33-unit Permanent Supportive Housing project dedicated to termed-out foster youth and homeless youth; and (2) authorize the Executive Director, or his designee, to execute the Disposition and Development Agreement with The Aspire, LP, including making minor and non-substantive changes. 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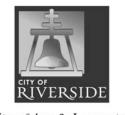

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the California Tax Credit Allocation Committee, and to the City of Riverside for up to \$500,000 in Home Investment Partnerships Act Funds, was presented and adopted.

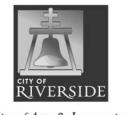

Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Edwards and seconded by Councilwoman Plascencia that the Housing Authority (1) approve a Disposition and Development Agreement with Riverside Housing Development Corporation for sale of Housing Authority property located at 3943 Tenth Street for \$1 to facilitate renovation of the building to create affordable housing units; and (2) authorize the Executive Director, or his designee, to execute the Disposition and Development Agreement with Riverside Housing Development Corporation, including making minor and non-substantive changes. 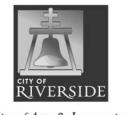

AGREEMENT - COVID RESPONSE STREET NURSE OUTREACH PROGRAM - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) accepted a grant award in the amount of \$100,000 from Kaiser Permanente National Benefit Fund at the East Bay Community Foundation to fund the



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COVID Response Street Nurse Outreach Program; (2) authorized an increase in estimated revenues in the amount of \$100,000 to Kaiser Permanente Street Nurse Outreach Account No. 9917300-339000 and appropriated expenditures in the same amount to Kaiser Permanente Street Nurse Outreach Account No. 9917300-440309; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Grant Agreement with Kaiser Permanente National Community Benefit Fund at the East Bay Community Foundation, including making minor and non-substantive changes.

BID 7789 - REPLACEMENT MEDIUM-DUTY UTILITY VEHICLES

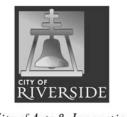
The City Council awarded Bid 7789 to Fritts Ford of Riverside, California, for purchase of four replacement medium-duty utility vehicles for the Public Works Department Sewer Division in the total amount of \$135,361.55.

LEASE AGREEMENT AMENDMENT - RIVERSIDE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT - 6936 FLIGHT

The City Council (1) approved the First Amendment to Riverside Municipal Airport Lease with Commemorative Air Force, a Texas nonprofit corporation, for five years through December 31, 2025, set an annual rent increase of 1.5 percent and authorized a sixmonth rent deferment; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the First Amendment to Riverside Municipal Airport Lease with Commemorative Air Force, including making minor and non-substantive changes.

EMPLOYER PAID MEMBER CONTRIBUTIONS - MASTER FRINGE BENEFITS AND SALARY PLAN AMENDMENT - ELIMINATE PARTNERSHIP COMPENSATION MODEL SALARY ADJUSTMENT -**RESOLUTIONS**

The City Council adopted (1) a Resolution for paying and reporting the value of Employer Paid Member Contributions for Tier 1 employees in the unrepresented units effective January 8, 2021; and (2) a Resolution to amend the Fringe Benefit and Salary Plan to update the Partnership Compensation Model salary adjustment for all employees in the



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unrepresented units; whereupon, the titles having been read and further readings waived, Resolution No. 23662 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Paying and Reporting the Value of Employer Paid Member Contributions, Effective January 8, 2021, and Resolution No. 23663 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Resolution No. 21052 and the Master Fringe Benefits and Salary Plan to Eliminate The Partnership Compensation Model Salary Adjustment for All Unrepresented Employees in the Executive (Includes Safety), Senior Management, Management, Professional, Paraprofessional, Supervisory and Confidential Units, were presented and adopted.

AGREEMENT AMENDMENT - COMPUTER-AIDED DISPATCH SYSTEM

The City Council (1) approved the Second Amendment to Maintenance and Support Agreement SA 276 with Motorola Solutions, Inc., for Computer-Aided Dispatch and PremierOne Mobile Service to extend coverage for eight additional years through December 31, 2028, per Section 403 of Purchasing Resolution No. 23256, in the amount of \$1,851,680 for a cumulative amount of \$3,094,324; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Second Amendment, annual renewal or continuation documents, and any additional documentation to effectuate this Amendment to the Maintenance and Support Agreement SA 276 with Motorola Solutions, Inc., including making minor and non-substantive changes.

RULES OF LIBRARY CONDUCT - ORDINANCE ADOPTED

The City Council adopted an Ordinance amending Title 9 of the Municipal Code by adding Chapter 9.75 establishing the Rules of Library Conduct; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Ordinance No. 7546 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Title 9 of the Riverside Municipal Code by Adding Chapter 9.75 Establishing the Rules of Library Conduct, was presented and adopted.

SPECIAL TRANSPORTATION DIVISION SHORT RANGE TRANSIT PLAN

The City Council (1) adopted the Special Transportation Division Short Range Transit Plan covering Fiscal Years 2020/21 to 2022/23; (2) authorized an increase in estimated revenues in the amount of \$698,736 as detailed in the Fiscal Impact Section of the written staff report; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to submit to Riverside



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County Transportation Commission the Transportation Development Act, State of Good Repair, and State Transit Assistance claims forms for Fiscal Year 2020/21.

FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION FUNDS - LOCAL TRANSPORTATION FUNDS - TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT CREDITS - SPECIAL TRANSPORTATION DIVISION - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) accepted grant funds from the Federal Transit Administration in the amount of \$640,000, matching Local Transportation Funds in the amount of \$96,000, and Transportation Development Credits in the amount of \$64,000; (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all grant documents, including making minor and non-substantive changes to documents associated with the grant; and (3) authorized an increase in revenues in the Special Transit Fund in the amount of \$640,000 to CA-2020-165-00 Preventative Maintenance Account 9272300-331301 and \$96,000 to Article 4 LTF account 0000560-335912 and appropriated expenditures in the Special Transit Fund in the same amount to CA-2020-165-00 Preventative Maintenance Account 9272300-424230.

BULLETPROOF VEST PARTNERSHIP - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION

The City Council (1) approved acceptance of grant funding in the amount of \$5,849.07 from the 2020 Patrick Leahy Bulletproof Vest Partnership Program from the Bureau of Justice Assistance for the period of April 1, 2020, through August 31, 2022; (2) authorized an increase in revenues in the amount of \$5,849.07 in the Grants and Special Programs Fund and appropriated expenditures in the same amount in the Grants and Special Programs Fund to the account for the Bureau of Justice Assistance, Bulletproof Vest Partnership Program; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the agreement with the Bureau of Justice Assistance, 2020 Patrick Leahy Bulletproof Vest Partnership Program, including making minor and non-substantive changes.

OFFICIAL POLICE TOWING SERVICE CONTRACTS - URGENCY ORDINANCE ADOPTED The City Council adopted an Urgency Ordinance amending Section 5.15.080(B) of the Riverside Municipal Code to add an option to extend the Official Police Towing Service Contracts for up to one year necessary as an emergency measure to preserve the public peace, health, and safety; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Urgency Ordinance No. 7547 of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Section 5.15.080(B) of the Riverside Municipal Code to Add an Option to Extend the



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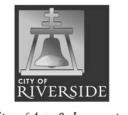

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA PUBLIC POWER AUTHORITY BI-ANNUAL EXPENDITURE REPORT The City Council received and ordered filed the Southern California Public Power Authority bi-annual expenditure report for Fiscal Year 2019-20.

CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF RESOURCES RECYCLING AND RECOVERY BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING GRANT PROGRAM - FISCAL YEAR 2020-21 AND FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 - SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS - RESOLUTION

The City Council (1) approved submission of a grant funding request to the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program RBC 32 Fiscal Year 2020/21 and RBC 33 Fiscal Year 2021/22 in the amount of \$250,000 each year, for a total of \$500,000; (2) upon grant award, authorized: (a) an increase in revenues and appropriated expenditures in the amount of \$250,000 to the Grants and Restricted Programs Fund 20/21 RBC 32 grant account; and (b) an increase in revenues and appropriated expenditures in the amount of \$250,000 to the Grants and Restricted Programs Fund 21/22 RBC 33 account; and (3) adopted a resolution authorizing the City Manager, or his designee, to execute all necessary applications, contracts, payment requests, agreements and amendments in the process of applying for and securing funding for the grant; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23664 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Authorizing the City Manager to Execute on Behalf of the City of Riverside All Necessary Applications, Contracts, Payment Requests, Agreements and Amendments in the Process of Applying for and Securing Funds Under the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CALRECYCLE) Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program RBC 32 (FY 2020/21) and RBC 33 (FY 2021/22), was presented and adopted.

BID 7788 - FISCAL YEAR 2019-20 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT FOOTPATH AND STREET IMPROVEMENTS - VARIOUS LOCATIONS The City Council (1) awarded Bid 7788 for Fiscal Year 2019/20 Community Development Block Grant Americans with Disabilities Act Footpath and Street Improvements to Onyx Paving Company, Inc., Anaheim, California, in the amount of \$909,000; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the construction contract with Onyx Paving Company, Inc., including making minor non-substantial changes.



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PUBLIC HEARINGS/PLANNING REFERRALS AND APPEALS

CODE OF ETHICS AND CONDUCT REVIEW
