BACKGROUND

- 1. On October 28, 2019, RPU's Board approved Work Order No. 2008392 in the total amount of \$850,000 to address the emerging contaminants (PFAS).
- 2. Part of the approved amount will be assigned to test Bituminous Coal Based Caron for reduction of PFAS.

Goal:

Mitigate PFAS below notification levels at RPU'S compliance points during low demand (Winter) and continue to provide the highest quality water to the community.

DISCUSSION

- 1. Two Proposals were received from Calgon Carbon Corporation and Carbon Activated Corporation.
- 2. Professional Services are ranked without seeing pricing, per our purchasing policy. A panel from Water Resources and Planning Engineering, Water Quality and Regulatory Compliance, and Operations staff evaluated the proposals.
- 3. Proposals were scored based on Qualifications/Product Removal Efficiencies (50%), Pricing (5%), Experience (Projects of similar size and scope) (4%), Professional References (1%), Ability to meet custom reactivation criteria (40%)

DISCUSSION

1. The proposals ranking is summarized in the table below:

Corporation	City Location	Rank
Calgon Carbon Corporation	Moon Township, PA	1
Carbon Activated Corporation	Compton, CA	2


2. Therefore, Calgon Caron Corp. will fill the first available GAC vessel, and Carbon Activated Corporation will fill the second available GAC vessel.



BACKGROUND

- PFAS (Per-and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances) are human-made chemicals.
- Perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) are the most extensively produced and analyzed for regulatory standards





Family of 1000s of chemicals




BACKGROUND 1. Repel oil and water


Long-term exposure linked to:


- -PFOS: High cholesterol levels, ulcerative colitis, thyroid disease, testicular and kidney cancers, pregnancy induced hypertension
- -PFOA: Decreased vaccination response, liver damage, and decreased birth rate

Science Advisory Board to USEPA and World Health Organization considers PFOA a: "..likely human carcinogen"




Units of Measure: Parts Per Trillion



- a. 1 part per trillion (ppt) 1 in 1,000,000,000,000
- b. 1 grain of sugar in an Olympic-sized pool
- c. 1 second in 320 centuries





- 1. RPU has detected PFAS within several raw water wells (Spring 2020 results):
 - a) 19 wells for PFOA and 22 wells for PFOS in excess of notification levels.
 - b) 10 wells for PFOA and zero well for PFOS in excess of response levels.

- 1. RPU's customers water remains below the notification levels for PFOS and PFOA at the point of compliance during high demand because of RPU treatments:
 - a) Ion Exchange (IX): mainly for Perchlorate;
 - b) Granular Activated Carbon (GAC): mainly for DBCP, TCE and 1,2,3-TCP; and
 - c) Blending at the Linden/Evans Reservoirs prior to distribution.

Carbon Adsorption: granular activated carbon (GAC)




Ion Exchange (IX) resin





Reverse Osmosis or Nanofiltration (RO or NF)

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Riverside Public Utilities Board:

- 1. Approve a Professional Consultant Services agreement with Calgon Carbon Corporation for Granular Activated Carbon Testing for a term through December 31, 2021 in an amount not to exceed \$106,000;
- 2. Approve a Professional Consultant Services Agreement with Carbon Activated Corporation for Granular Activated Carbon Testing for a term through December 31, 2021 in an amount not to exceed \$121,000; and
- 3. Authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Professional Consultant Services Agreements with Calgon Carbon and Carbon Activated, including making minor and non-substantive changes and to sign all documents and instruments necessary to complete the transactions.
