California's protection & advocacy system

What is a Protection & Advocacy Agency?

- P&As work to improve the lives of people with disabilities by guarding against abuse; advocating for basic rights; and ensuring access and accountability in health care, education, employment, housing, transportation, voting, and within the juvenile and criminal justice systems.
- P&As are the only legally based advocacy organization established by Congress to protect the rights of all individuals with disabilities. As part of that mandate, our network includes agencies in every state and U.S. territory, working to provide legal protection and advocacy services for people with disabilities.



Our Mission & Vision

- DRC advocates, educates, investigates, and litigates to advance the rights, dignity, equal opportunities, and choices for all people with disabilities.
- We envision a **barrier-free**, **inclusive**, **diverse** world that values each individual and their voice. In this world, all people with disabilities enjoy the power of equal rights and opportunities; freedom from abuse, neglect, and discrimination; dignity; and respect for their choices based on their own goals and values.



Eligibility for Our Services

- We provide free legal services to **people with disabilities** seeking eligibility for or navigating challenges in various systems, including special education, Regional Center, and the Department of Rehabilitation.
- Our goal is to serve people with disabilities from racial and ethnic diverse communities. To make sure our services are accessible to people who do not speak English or are Deaf, we hire staff who speak other languages, provide interpreters and translate our self-advocacy materials into other languages, formats and American Sign Language.



Our Practice Groups

Our Legal Advocacy Unit has seven practice groups, which provide free legal services and trainings to individuals with disabilities:

- 1. Civil Rights
- 2. Healthcare/Home & Community-Based Services
- 3. Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities
- 4. Mental Health
- 5. Pathways to Work
- 6. Voting Rights
- 7. Youth



Youth Practice Group

The YPG provides free legal services to students with disabilities, including:

- Trainings and Counsel & Advice for parents and students to empower them to self-advocate
- Demand letters to assist with obtaining appropriate assessments, correcting inaccurate disciplinary records, and more
- Representation in IEP and 504 meetings
- Representation in expulsion hearings and manifestation determination reviews
- Representation in due process hearings, and complaints to the California Department of Education and U.S. Department of Education



Client Assistance Program (CAP)

- CAP helps people get services from the Department of Rehabilitation (DOR). Examples of DOR services are training, school, and a job.
- CAP provides information; advice and advocacy to help people with disabilities get rehabilitation services from the DOR, such as training, education and a job.
- CAP advocates help protect the rights of people who receive or need services from Independent Living Centers, or other Rehabilitation Act Funded partners.
- People can obtain assistance from CAP at any point from the time they apply for services to after receipt of services.



Office of Clients' Rights Advocacy (OCRA)

- Providing free legal information, advice and representation to regional center clients. We provide the clients' rights advocate for each regional center.
- OCRA provides assistance to Regional Center consumers, including:
 - Representation at IPP and/or IEP meetings
 - Assistance with navigating IHSS, SSI, and other systems
