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# MUSEUM PROJECTS' MEASURE Z IMPACT PART 1 – DOWNTOWN SITE

### Renovation/Expansion of Mission Inn Avenue Site

This is the only Museum Department project for which Measure Z funds are currently allocated.

### PATH OF MEASURE Z ALLOCATION

- January 31, 2017 City Council reviewed a Measure Z spending plan that estimated \$15 million for "Museum Expansion and Rehab."
- December 19, 2017 City Council amended the plan to reallocate \$1.3 million from the Museum to the Main Library for City Archives, leaving \$13.7 million.




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## PATH OF MEASURE Z ALLOCATION

 March 12, 2020 – The Budget Engagement Commission endorsed the option to renovate the downtown site with a two-story expansion. Construction cost estimation \$24,468,000.




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# MAIN MUSEUM RECAP RENOVATION + TWO-STORY EXPANSION

- Design meets 104% of desired program.
- Net 40% increase in square footage.
- No reduction of original functional scope.




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# CONSTRUCTION COST RECAP RENOVATION + TWO-STORY EXPANSION

- Renovation and onestory expansion:
   \$22,068,000
- Exhibition design and gallery equipment: \$2,400,000
- TOTAL: \$24,468,000

## **CURRENT CIRCUMSTANCES**

- COVID-19 impacts immediately followed.
- Two-year postponement; work is to resume in FY2022-2023.
- Museum suspended work with its architect; Phase I contract remains open.





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# CONSTRUCTION COST RECAP RENOVATION + TWO-STORY EXPANSION

NOTE: Table lists costs from October 2019 estimate. Architects estimate 6% annual escalation.

Construction cost – renovation (18,400 sf)	\$ 7,728,000
Construction cost – expansion (11,200 sf)	\$ 7,560,000
Site costs	\$ 1,500,000
Soft costs @ 40%	\$ 5,280,000
Exhibition design	\$ 400,000
Exhibition installation	\$ 2,000,000
Total	\$24,468,000

# MUSEUM PROJECTS' MEASURE Z IMPACT PART 2 – HARADA HOUSE

#### Rehabilitation of Harada House

Measure Z funding has **not** been allocated for this project.



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## HARADA HOUSE UPDATE

- In 1990, Harada House, the subject of a seminal legal case, was named a National Historic Landmark.
- In 2003, the house was donated by Harada family heirs to the Museum.

### HARADA HOUSE UPDATE

- Due to its compromised structural condition, the Museum has never been able to open the house to the public.
- Issues include termite damage, deferred maintenance, water incursion, and foundation subsidence.



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## HARADA HOUSE UPDATE

- Two historic preservation architects' rehabilitation plans with cost estimates were obtained in August 2019.
- Staff analysis of these plans resulted in an estimated project cost of \$5.3 million.

## HARADA HOUSE UPDATE

- At our direction, the architects phased the approaches to rehabilitation.
- Three construction phases permit adjustment for discontinuous fundraising.

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## HARADA HOUSE UPDATE

The Harada House
 Foundation endorsed a \$6.5 million campaign in November 2019, which includes an allocation for endowment.

Fundraising Campaign Goals and Phases



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## HARADA HOUSE UPDATE

- In August 2020, the Museum received a federal "Save America's Treasures" grant to begin Phase I of the rehabilitation.
- Harada campaign progress stands at 13.5% of the \$6.5 million goal.



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## **RECOMMENDATION**

That the Budget Engagement Commission receive and file an update from the Museum Department on Museum projects, including the museum renovation funded by Measure Z and the Harada House.



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
