THE PURCHASE OF SIX (6) REPLACEMENT UTILITY VEHICLES FOR THE PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT, PARKS

**DIVISION IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$354,875.11** 

## ISSUE:

Award Bid No. 7806 to Fritts Ford of Riverside, California for the purchase of six (6) replacement utility vehicles for the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department, Parks Division in the total amount of \$354,875.11.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the City Council award Bid No. 7806 to Fritts Ford of Riverside, California for the purchase of six (6) replacement utility vehicles for the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department, Parks Division in the total amount of \$354,875.11.

#### **BACKGROUND**:

The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department, Parks Division is responsible for maintaining various parks and facilities throughout the City. Field staff meet operational needs through the use of utility vehicles.

Six utility vehicles have been removed from service and retired due to high maintenance costs and expired Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fuel tanks. Recommended replacement vehicles meet operational needs and also include an upgraded towing capacity permitting staff to tow equipment and building supplies that exceeded the towing capacity of the retired utility vehicles.

On January 14, 2021 the Purchasing Division, in cooperation with the General Services Department, solicited formal bids for the purchase of six (6) utility vehicles. On January 28, 2021 the City received one (1) bid in response to Bid No. 7806 for the purchase of one (1) F250, four (4) F350's, and one (1) F450 for a total of six (6) utility vehicles. The bid from Fritts Ford of Riverside was deemed the lowest responsive bidder in the total amount of \$354,875.11.

The Fleet Division evaluates all vehicle replacement criteria to ensure efficient management and replacement of vehicles. The retired trucks have exceeded their expected service life and there are no existing Fleet vehicles that meet the replacement requirements.
