CAL/OSHA UPDATE

- 8 CCR 3205 COVID-19 Prevention Program (CPP)
 - a) Emergency Regulation
 - i. Effective Date: November 30, 2020
 - ii. Expiration Date: October 2, 2021, unless amended
 - b) Applies to all employees and places of employment
 - c) City policy created to comply with regulation
 - i. V 09 COVID-19 Prevention Program
 - ii. Effective date: December 2020

REGULATION REQUIREMENTS

- Requirements adopted in city policy
 - a) Investigate and respond effectively to COVID-19 cases
 - i. Notify possibly exposed employees within one day
 - ii. Offer COVID-19 testing at no cost (internal Curative site)
 - b) Specific requirements for multiple COVID infections and outbreaks in the workplace
 - i. Reporting to local health authorities
 - c) Workplace Audits
 - i. Workplace Audits/Evaluations
 - -Completed initially and during changes to processes or procedures
 - ii. Periodic Inspections
 - Used to identify unhealthy conditions, work practices and/or procedures related to COVID-19
 - Ensure compliance with current COVID-19 policies and procedures

LESSONS LEARNED

- · Government can be nimble, adaptive, and agile;
- Cross-coordination works:
- Communicate often and well:
- Invest in planning (planning is key, not necessarily the plan);
- Update RMC Policy Group is meant for a single, limited time event;
- EOC is a whole City responsibility;
- Regularly practice EOC Operations for a range of possibilities;
- Maintain a network of community partners;
- A declared emergency is often accompanied by others; and
- Investments in emergency preparedness pay off.
