#### **BACKGROUND**

- 1. For over 25 years, the Firework Shows have been a highlight of Riverside's Fourth of July Celebration, with shows at La Sierra Park and atop Mt. Rubidoux;
- 2. Coordination efforts between various departments: PRCSD, Riverside Fire and Police, Traffic Engineering, Arts and Cultural Affairs and Code Enforcement;
- 3. Annually, the firework shows attract over 100,000 families;

#### **BACKGROUND (CONT.)**

- 4. As a result of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) and for public safety, the 2020 firework shows were cancelled; and
- 5. The Fireworks Taskforce continues to improve outreach efforts, Citywide, to ensure the public understands that fireworks are illegal in the City of Riverside.

- 2. Task Force monitors incoming 3-1-1 texts and dispatch traffic to assist in enforcement.
- 3. Task Force patrols the City specifically to enforce the City's firework ordinance.

#### **ENHANCED 2021 FIREWORKS PROGRAM**

- **1. Press Conference**: Prior to the holiday, the Fireworks Task Force will participate in a press conference regarding the City's stance on fireworks.
- 2. Enforcement Activities: RPD and RFD will send out and hand deliver warning letters to persons known of utilizing fireworks to advise that fireworks are illegal and there will be a \$1,000 fine if caught using, selling and/or possessing them.
- **3. Marketing and Outreach**: RFD, RPD, Code and Riverside TV developed new fireworks Public Safety Announcements (PSA's) for television and Social Media.

#### **ENHANCED 2021 FIREWORKS PROGRAM CONT'D**

- **4. Staffing:** RFD, RPD and Code will have dedicated personnel on duty at various times during the holiday season. These personnel will be specifically committed to enforcing the fireworks ordinance.
- **5.** Communications: The 3-1-1 app, Emergency (911) and Non-Emergency dispatch numbers (951) 354-2007 will be monitored and utilized to assist the task force with patrol efforts.

### CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH: PUBLIC GATHERINGS

### CDPH Guidance for the Prevention of COVID-19 Transmission for Gatherings

A gathering of no more than three households is permitted in a public park or other outdoor space, even if unrelated gatherings of other groups up to three households are also occurring in the same park or other outdoor space. If multiple such gatherings are occurring, mixing between groups gatherings is not allowed.

Additionally, multiple gatherings of three households cannot be jointly organized or coordinated to occur in the same public park or other outdoor space at the same time – this would constitute a gathering exceeding the permitted household limits.

#### **LOGISTICS IMPACT**

#### Evaluation of sites (Mt. Rubidoux and La Sierra Park)

- Multiple departments involved (RFD, PRCSD, RPD)
- Weed abatement process required for Mt. Rubidoux minimum of 150 hours to complete
- Tree Trimming required at both sites
- Deemed non-essential, additional staff would need to be activated to complete tasks

### Procurement Process

- Deemed as non-essential, PRCSD staff will need to be activated to procure fencing, portable restrooms, legal agreement, fireworks, fire permit, traffic plan, special events permit, etc.
- **Pre-Event Set-Up**
- · Notification to residents
- Prep for firework set up at Mt. Rubidoux
- Installation of fencing at La Sierra Park

## 2021 OPTION ONE SHOW ONLY AT LA SIERRA PARK

- 1. In order to reduce the financial impact and resources required, this option would limit to hosting the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Show at La Sierra Park only.
- 2. This option would require funding in the amount **\$50,500** in pyro expenses, non-personnel expenses, part-time staff and over-time costs.
- 3. Part of the original RFP No. 7817; bid has already been approved and company is able to proceed.
- 4. Staff has traffic plan and logistics ready for event at this site.

### 2021 OPTION TWO SHOWS AT LA SIERRA & RYAN BONAMINIO PARKS

For the safety of residents and visitors, having two locations with firework shows will aid with congestion and large gatherings.

- 1. Park has pre-existing traffic plan and logistics from previous special events;
- 2. It's at the opposite end of the La Sierra Park area; and
- 3. Has adequate open space for the fireworks' fall-out zone.

Having fireworks at Ryan Bonaminio Park (or any other additional site) will require the City to post a new Request for Proposal (RFP). An exact cost will only be available once the bids are received.

#### MT. RUBIDOUX - EVENT SITE

#### Not recommended; however, a continuously requested site.

- 1. Excessive crowding and parking on narrow streets.
- 2. The inability to quickly evacuate the area in the event of an emergency.
- 3. Potential delay in response times for additional emergency resources that may be requested.
- 4. Ideal weed abatement not possible.
