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OFFICE OF HOMELESS SOLUTIONS

- Homeless Services: Develops public and private partnerships to address homelessness through outreach services that coordinate supportive services and resources to reduce and prevent homelessness
- Housing Authority: Create and maintain affordable, decent, safe and stable housing to help our residents thrive and increase their potential for long-term economic success and a sustained high quality of life

- Affordable Housing: Development of affordable housing units
- Employment: Provide homeless individuals placed in housing with onthe-job training
- Healthcare: Nurse Outreach Worker (NOW) Program
- Housing stability: Homeless prevention and rental assistance programs

- Shelter: Riverside Emergency Shelter, Bridge Housing, and Pallet Shelter
