- 7 cities require City Council Members to submit a verbal or written request to either the City Manager, City Clerk, or Mayor (or a combination of the 3) for approval for the item to be agendized
- 23 cities require City Council Members to make a verbal request during a public meeting and need a majority vote (of the quorum) for an item to be agendized

NOTE Some cities use more than one method and therefore may have been counted twice in the summary
