

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
FUND REALLOCATION


- Community needs evolved over the course of the pandemic resulting in a reallocation of resources as permitted in the expenditure and contingency plan.
- Resources were shifted from the Housing/Homelessness category to both the Community and Business Support and Organizational Needs for COVID-19 Compliance category.
- In late December 2020, the Department of Finance authorized any unspent CARES Act funds to be allocated to Public Safety Payroll in lieu of returning monies to the state.



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COMMUNITY AND BUSINESS SUPPORT

Programs benefiting the Community and Business Support category included a wide range of key areas including small business grants, distance learning, emotional and social support, support to families and children, food resiliency, and non-profit assistance. Community and Business Support highlights include:





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RECOMMENDATIONS

That the City Council:

- 1. Receive a final report on the implementation of the approved Expenditure Plan for Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funding;
- 2. Review and provide input on the proposed expenditure categories for the development of the Expenditure Plan for the American Rescue Plan Act funding; and
- 3. With at least five affirmative votes, and upon receipt of the award, authorize the Chief Financial Officer, or his designee, to record an increase in revenue and appropriate expenditures in an equal amount of \$36,747,594, to accounts to be established by the Finance Department.



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
