
Maximize Roads / Streets (Pavement Condition Index - PCI)



City's PCI: 61/100;

Consultant hired on October 6, 2020 to provide annual pavement surveys though 2025. The first report will be received in December 2021.







**FY 2018/19-** Completed 10.13 miles of pavement improvements including repair of curb and gutter, sidewalks, driveways, ramps, and sign installations.



**FY 2019/20 -** Funding will improve 28.99 miles of pavement including reconstruction of damaged concrete curbs, gutters, sidewalks, driveways, pedestrian ramps, install signs, and pavement delineation.



**FY 2020/21 -** Projects are in design phase.



**FY 2021/22 -** Projects are in planning phase.



Monroe Master Storm Drain Project -

Construction expected to begin in October 2021; project will construct over 2 miles of underground storm drain pipes and ancillary structures; repave Gratton Street (Lincoln Avenue to Hermosa Drive) and intersection of Adam Street and Dufferin Avenue.

New Downtown Main Library & Archives Library opened in June 2021



City Council awarded the **Architectural Design Service** agreement on December 8, 2020.



### **Annual Deferred Maintenance (Existing Facilities)**

- City Hall Parking garage grill, boiler, and chiller replaced; installed security doorpad controllers and sensors.
- Various Fire Stations Backflow and concrete walkway repairs; transfer switches replaced.
- Fox Theater ADA improvements.
- Various Libraries Bathroom improvements, HVAC, and security and lighting updates.
- **Museum -** Fire alarm panel replaced, ceiling and HVAC repairs; asphalt/paving repairs at Heritage House.
- Various Parks Gymnasium floor resurfacing, HVAC, asbestos removal, roof repairs, playground repairs, fencing, security lighting, playground and basketball courts resurfacing.
- Various Police Stations Helipad repairs; doors, security lighting, flooring, and HVAC improvements.

#### **CRITICAL UNFUNDED NEEDS**

#### General Plan **Update**

- **Phase I** began in September 2020 and included Housing Element, Public Safety Element, Environmental Justice Policies, General Plan Amendment, Specific Plans - Amendments, Zoning Code Changes, Rezoning Program, Programmatic Environmental Impact Report; City Council public hearing scheduled for October 2021.
- Phase 2 will include all remaining portions of the General Plan, comprehensive update of the Zoning Code, Specific Plans - Amendments; RFP anticipated for release in November 2021.



#### **Public Works Street Vehicle & Equipment Needs**

\$2,000,000 allocated in FY 2021/22 and extending through FY 2024/25 for a total of \$5,230,000.

**Currently the Department is** working with General Services to secure quotes for the following:

- Grader
- Wheel loader
- Bobcat with highlift and broom
- Backhoe
- 2 patch trucks
- 2 dump Trucks



#### **Motorhome Removal & Disposal**

- \$45,000 annually
- All tow companies contracted with the Police Department have been notified of the fund and how to submit for reimbursement.



#### Park and Neighborhood Specialist Program

\$2,393,098 in FY 2021/22 and extending through FY 2024/25 for a total of \$10,437,471. This spending item includes funding for:

- 20 full-time benefited positions
- **Purchase 22 bicycles**
- Purchase five alternate fuel vehicles
- 2 dump trucks

#### Parks & Recreation Infrastructure, Vehicles, and Equipment



#### \$1,965,000 in FY 2021/22 includes:

- Mt. Rubidoux Trail Surface
- Rehabilitation purchase of one (1) tractor
- Fairmount Park Wier Dam and Storm Drain Project
- Swimming pool maintenance at Hunt, Reid, and Villegas Parks
