PAINTING OF SIX TRAFFIC SIGNAL CABINETS WITH ARTISTIC FEATURES - RIVERWALK PARKWAY BETWEEN SOUTH AND NORTH OF PIERCE STREET

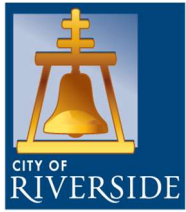
Following discussion, it was moved by Vice Chair Hemenway and seconded by Member Perry recommending that the City Council approve the Public Works Department's request to seek competitive bids and/or quotes from local artists to paint six traffic signal cabinets on Riverwalk Parkway between Pierce Street (South) to Pierce Street (North). The motion carried unanimously.

ESTABLISH AXLE RESTRICTION ON SEGMENT OF LA SIERRA AVENUE

Following discussion, it was moved by Member Perry and seconded by Vice Chair Hemenway recommending the City Council approve the establishment of an axle restriction prohibiting use by commercial vehicles exceeding three axles on La Sierra Avenue from the southerly City limits to the SR-91 Freeway. The motion carried unanimously.
