Mayor Lock Dawson called the meeting to order at 12:13 p.m.

TOUR OF HUNTER HOBBY PARK - 1401 IOWA

Rich Casford gave a presentation and tour to the Mayor and City Council of Hunter Hobby Park Live Steamers Railroad located at 1401 Iowa Avenue.

Councilmember Cervantes arrived at Hunter Hobby Park at 12:25 p.m.

Councilmembers Mill and Perry were absent.

The meeting at Hunter Hobby Park was adjourned at 1:15 p.m.

The Mayor and City Council reconvened at 3:00 p.m. in the Art Pick Council Chamber with Mayor Lock Dawson presiding and all Councilmembers present.

MAYOR/COUNCILMEMBER COMMUNICATIONS

Councilmember Falcone reported on the 31st Annual Old Riverside Foundation Home tour, Heritage House Ice Cream Social, and beautification event at the Military Wall of Honor. Councilmember Cervantes reported on Longfellow Elementary School bike giveaway, tree planting event, and Arts and Music Festival at Lincoln Park. Councilmember Robillard reported on a visit to Prism Aerospace, grand opening of Lettle Insurance Service, and Janet Goeske Center 40th anniversary event. Councilmember Conder reported on Grove Community Church - Just One More Life event, Armed Forces Day on May 18, Steps for Vets event, shared the story of Joseph Alexander, and the significance of celebrating Memorial Day. Councilmember Mill reported on League of Cities meeting in Indian Wells, visit to Police Department Dispatch Center, Great



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American Cleanup, nature preserve tour at Hidden Valley, Peace Officers Memorial Day, congratulated Councilmember Cervantes for obtaining her Master's Degree and requested to fly the Flag at half-staff on May 15 in honor of fallen officers. Councilmember Perry reported on Peace Officers month in May. 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CONSENT CALENDAR

It was moved by Councilmember Hemenway and seconded by Councilmember Perry to approve the Consent Calendar as presented affirming the actions appropriate to each item with Mayor Lock Dawson voting aye on the Board and Commission appointments. The motion carried unanimously.

BOARD AND COMMISSION APPOINTMENTS

The Mayor and City Council appointed (1) Joyce O. Clarke to the Commission on Aging Ward 3 seat for a term through March 1, 2028; and (2) Charles Dillon to the Community Police Review Commission Ward 7 seat for a term through March 1, 2028.

CASE SD-2024-00001 - STREET VACATION - SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING - 2485 SUNRISE - RESOLUTION

The City Council (1) adopted a resolution declaring its intent to hold a public hearing on June 18, 2024 to consider Planning Case SD-2024-00001 Street Vacation of Sunrise Place, situated on the west side of Sunrise Place, to facilitate a private driveway; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 24111 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Declaring its Intention to Vacate Approximately 11,390 Square Feet of Public Right-of-Way Consisting of the Entirety of Sunrise Place, and Setting the Date, Hour and Place of Hearing, Pursuant to the Public Streets, Highways, and Service Easements Vacation Law, was presented and adopted.

AMENDMENT - SCHEDULE OF LICENSED PROPERTY - CANYON CREST RV73XC17 - CELL TOWER LICENSE

The City Council (1) approved the First Amendment to Schedule of Licensed Property with SBA 2012 TC Assets, LLC for Site number CA-6062G - Canyon Crest (RV73Xc17) to consent to sublicensee; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the First Amendment to Schedule of Licensed Property, including making minor and non-substantive changes.

DEFAULT OF CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT FOR WALKING PATH IMPROVEMENTS - LA SIERRA PARK PROJECT BID 7761

The City Council (1) found Millsten Enterprises, Inc., in default of the Contract for the Construction of the Walking Path Improvements at La Sierra Park Project – Bid 7761, as



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required by the Contract documents; (2) approved the acceptance of funds from the Contractors Surety, Liberty Mutual Surety into the General Fund; (3) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to terminate Millsten Enterprises, Inc's right to perform under the Contract by issuing a written Notice of Termination for Default to the Contractor and its Surety, Liberty Mutual Surety; and (4) authorized City Manager, or designee, to execute any agreements or documents necessary to carry out the contract termination and effectuate the completion of the project, including documents and agreements needed to carry out the Surety's obligations under the contract and performance bond.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL 2322 - DESIGN BUILD AGREEMENT - FAIRMOUNT PARK WAYFINDING SIGNAGE PROJECT

The City Council (1) approved the Design-Build Services Agreement for Request for Proposal 2322, with Square Signs, LLC, dba Front Signs, Burbank, for Design-Build Services for the Fairmount Park Wayfinding Signage Project, in the amount of \$139,950; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Design Build Services Agreement with Square Signs, LLC, dba Front Signs, including making minor and non-substantive changes.

AGREEMENT - SPORTS LIGHTING SERVICES

The City Council (1) approved the Sports Lighting Agreement with Musco Sports Lighting, LLC, to perform the work of Sports Lighting with related technology equipment and services effective through June 16, 2027, in the amount of \$360,000, with three additional one-year extensions; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Agreement with Musco Sports Lighting, LLC, including making minor and non-substantive changes and future extensions.

AGREEMENT - CONVEYANCE OF EASEMENT FOR SEWER LINE - VILLEGAS PARK PROPERTY The City Council (1) approved Agreement for Conveyance of Easement to Riverside Unified School District for a sewer line on Villegas Park property to serve Casa Blanca Elementary School; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or designee, to execute the Agreement for Conveyance of Easement to Riverside Unified School District including making minor, non-substantive changes, and to sign all documents and instruments necessary to complete the transaction.



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FISCAL YEAR 2024-25 CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY AND FIRE PROTECTION URBAN AND COMMUNITY FORESTRY GRANT PROGRAM - LONG-TERM URBAN FORESTRY MANAGEMENT PLAN - RESOLUTION

The City Council adopted a Resolution authorizing the City Manager, or designee, to conduct negotiations, execute and submit all documents including applications, agreements, amendments, payment requests and other documents which may be necessary for the filing of an application for the funding from California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection Fiscal Year 2024-25 Urban and Community Forestry Grant Program for an amount up to \$1.5 million for development of a long-term urban forestry management plan; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 24112 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, for Funding from the Urban and Community Forestry Grant Program of the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, was presented and adopted.

DISCUSSION CALENDAR

ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES FOR FIREWORKS LAWS VIOLATIONS - WAIVE SUNSHINE ORDINANCE - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED

Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Perry and seconded by Councilmember Mill to waive the Sunshine Ordinance pursuant to Riverside Municipal Code section 4.05.050 (D)(2)(a) to consider introducing an ordinance to amend section 1.18.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code regarding penalty for a violation of the City's Fireworks laws. The motion carried unanimously.

Following further discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Perry and seconded by Councilmember Mill to introduce an ordinance amending section 1.18.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code to increase the penalty for a violation of the City's Fireworks laws from one thousand (\$1,000) to one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) per administrative citation. The motion carried with Councilmembers Falcone, Cervantes, Robillard, Mill, Perry, and Hemenway voting aye and Councilmember Conder voting no.

Whereupon, an ordinance entitled," An ordinance of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Section 1.18.040 of the Riverside Municipal Code Regarding Administrative Penalties for Violations of the City's Fireworks Laws," was presented and introduced.



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RIVERSIDE TRANSMISSION RELIABILITY PROJECT UPDATE

Following discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Hemenway and seconded by Councilmember Cervantes to retain outside legal counsel and consulting to determine the status of the project.

Following further discussion, a substitute motion was made by Councilmember Perry and seconded by Councilmember Falcone to (1) receive an update regarding Riverside Transmission Reliability Project (RTRP); (2) direct staff to continue implementation of the City portion of the Riverside Transmission Reliability Project; (3) direct Public Utilities Department staff to initiate a system capacity analysis and present findings and recommendations to the Board of Public Utilities to address short-term system capacity limitations in order to maintain safe, reliable and prudent operating standards; and (4) direct the City Manager and City Attorney to request that Southern California Edison reinitiate, without delay, the complete construction and operation of their portion of the Riverside Transmission Reliability Project. The motion carried with Councilmembers Falcone, Robillard, Mill, and Perry voting aye and Councilmembers Cervantes, Conder, and Hemenway voting no.

COMMUNICATIONS

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT ON CLOSED SESSIONS

City Attorney Norton announced that the closed session item to confer with and/or receive advice from legal counsel concerning Riverside All Of Us Or None, et al., v. City of Riverside, et al., U.S. District Court Case No. 5:23-cv-01536-SPG-SP was continued to the May 21, 2024 City Council meeting.

Mayo Pro Tem Hemenway announced that the closed session item to review the City Council's position regarding salaries, salary schedules, or compensation paid in the form of fringe benefits of the City Attorney was continued to the May 21, 2024 City Council meeting.

ITEMS FOR FUTURE CITY COUNCIL CONSIDERATION

Councilmember Perry requested Councilmembers use the Agenda Item Request Form when requesting items for future consideration.
