POLICE BALLISTIC HELMETS AND FACE SHIELDS

The City Council approved issuance of a Purchase Order to P&P Uniforms, Riverside, in the amount of \$87,912 from the Police Department Asset Forfeiture, Clothing/Linen/Safety Supplies and Police State COPS Grant Accounts for the purchase of 200 police ballistic helmets and face shields in accordance with Purchasing Resolution 22576, Section 201(g).

2015 HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM - SIGNATURE AUTHORITY - RESOLUTION

The City Council adopted a resolution designating the City Manager, or his designee, as the Authorized Agent for Signature Authority to execute all necessary grant agreement documents, grant assurances between the County of Riverside Office of Emergency Services, and any other actions necessary for the purpose of obtaining financial assistance provided by the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services and subgranted through the California State Department of Homeland Security; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 22972 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Authorizing the City Manager or his Designee to Execute and Submit All Necessary Documents of the California Emergency Management Agency for the State Homeland Security Grant Program 2015, was presented and adopted.

AGREEMENT - FIBER OPTIC CABLE NETWORK

The City Council (1) approved Work Order No. 1423746 for \$325,000 from the City-Wide Communication Network Account; (2) approved the Fiber Use License Agreement with the County of Riverside for reimbursement of \$302,246 for fiber optic cable network to connect three County facilities and \$14,280 annually for maintenance for three years; and (3) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Fiber Use License Agreement with the County of Riverside.

2015-16 TREE POWER PROGRAM FREE SHADE TREE COUPON CAMPAIGN

The City Council (1) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to issue purchase orders to Parkview Nurseries, Louie's Nursery, and Moon Valley Nurseries and make changes to the purchase order amounts based on the variable product demand of each nursery in a collective amount not-to-exceed \$650,00 for the Tree Power Program Free Shade Tree Coupon Campaign; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to credit customer accounts for trees purchased under the program in a collective amount not-to-exceed \$100,000 under the Tree Power Rebate Program from the Public Utilities Public Benefits Residential Tree Power Program

SAN ONOFRE NUCLEAR GENERATING STATION DECOMMISSIONING -RESOLUTION

BID 7351 REJECTION - TEQUESQUITE LANDFILL GAS FLARE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The City Council rejected all bids for construction and approved the release of the related bid bonds received for Bid 7351 for the Tequesquite Landfill Gas Flare Replacement Project.

AGREEMENT AMENDMENT - HIGH PRESSURE GAS COMPRESSOR SERVICE - RIVERSIDE WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLANT 5950 ACORN

The City Council approved and authorized the City Manager to execute the First Amendment to the Agreement with Accurate Air Engineering, Inc., for High Pressure Gas Compressor Service for repair of two compressors at the Riverside Water Quality Control Plant Co-Generation Facility located at 5950 Acorn bringing the total to \$61,111.31 from Public Works Department Budget.

FINAL PARCEL MAP 36888 - COTTONWOOD/INTERSTATE 215/OLD 215 FRONTAGE - RESOLUTION

location and an Exclusive Negotiating Agreement with the Discovery Science Foundation to conduct a feasibility analysis for a Discovery Cube Riverside in the existing main library building in Downtown. No formal action was required or taken.

MAIN LIBRARY PROJECT - 4019 MISSION INN

Following discussion, the City Council (1) committed the current library building located at 3581 Mission Inn Avenue to a cultural, public reuse; (2) selected 3911 University Avenue as the location for the new Main Library; and (3) directed the City Manager to determine funding options and begin planning the new Main Library.

CHILDREN'S SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTE -3581 MISSION INN

Following discussion, the City Council (1) approved an Exclusive Negotiation Agreement (ENA) with Discovery Science Foundation for a sixmonth term that may be extended for an additional six months by the City Manager to establish a period during which the Foundation shall have the exclusive right to conduct investigatory analyses of the existing City of Riverside Main Library located at 3581 Mission Inn Avenue, for the purpose of determining the feasibility, cost, funding sources, development, etc., of a children's science and technology educational institute and including preserving the exterior of the building and making the plaza available for festivals and events; (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Exclusive Negotiation Agreement and make minor nonsubstantive changes; (3) requested public meetings during the vetting process; and (4) requested the City Manager to report back to the City Council in six months.

COMMUNICATIONS

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT ON CLOSED SESSIONS

City Attorney Geuss reported that in closed session the City Council approved by a vote of six in favor and none opposed with Councilmember Burnard absent, the request of Councilmember Soubirous for reimbursement of attorney fees in the amount of \$1,055 related to an investigation of Councilmember Mike Soubirous. Further, the City Council makes the following statement: "We regret the actions taken with regard to the investigation of Councilmember Mike Soubirous. This includes the process of discussing the matter in closed session, yet hearing the matter publicly, denying the Councilmember a right to rebut with witnesses. We regret any damages to Councilmember Soubirous' reputation and sincerely hope this can move Council forward in the spirit of cooperation."
