#### CASE P14-0246 - ANNEXATION 118 - CENTRAL/SYCAMORE CANYON - RESOLUTION - ORDINANCE INTRODUCED

The City Council (1) adopted a resolution on behalf of Eric Flodine of Strata Crest, LLC., ordering the reorganization to the City of Riverside to incorporate approximately 16.6 acres known as Annexation 118, located northerly of Central Avenue and southwesterly of State Route 60, Interstate 215 Freeway; and (2) introduced an ordinance adding the area of Annexation 118 (Central/Sycamore) to the Second Ward; whereupon, the title having been read and further reading waived, Resolution No. 23102 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Ordering The Reorganization to the City of Riverside of that Certain Contiguous Uninhabited Territory Known as "Annexation 118 - Central/Sycamore Canyon, Generally Located Northerly of Central Avenue and Southwesterly of State Route 60, Interstate 215 Freeway" and Designated as "LAFCO No. 2015-08-1 Reorganization to Include Annexation 118 (Central Sycamore Canyon) to the City of Riverside and Concurrent Annexation to Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District and Concurrent Detachments from County Service Area 93 and the Riverside County Waste Resources Management District," was presented and adopted; whereupon, an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance of the City of Riverside, California, Amending Section 1.12.020 of the Riverside Municipal Code by Adding to the Second Ward the Territory Designated as "LAFCO No. 2015-08-1 Reorganization to Include Annexation No. 118 to the City of Riverside and Concurrent Annexation to Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District and Concurrent Detachments from County Service Area 93 and the Riverside County Waste Resources Management District" as of the Effective Date of Such Annexation to the City of Riverside," was presented and introduced.

#### URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE DONATION

#### LEASE AGREEMENT - FOX ENTERTAINMENT PLAZA FOOD AND BEVERAGE MARKET - 3605 MARKET

Following discussion, the City Council (1) approved a 55-Year Lease Agreement with Riverside Food Hall, LP, for an estimated minimum lease revenue of \$4,204,800 for the vacant Fox Entertainment Plaza restaurant space located at 3606 Market Street, to facilitate development of a food and beverage market; and (2) authorized the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the Lease Agreement, including making minor, non-substantive changes, and to sign all documents and instruments necessary to complete the transaction.

#### STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD WATER RECYCLING FUNDING PROGRAM - CONSTRUCTION OF JACKSON STREET RECYCLED WATER PIPELINE PROJECT PHASES I AND II - RESOLUTIONS

Following discussion, the City Council adopted a (1) resolution authorizing the City Manager, or his designee, to sign and submit the Clean Water State Revolving Fund application to the State Water Resources Control Board in the amount of \$21,315,000 for financial assistance for the Jackson Street Recycled Water Pipeline Project, Phase I and II; (2) reimbursement resolution for financing the costs of constructing the Project through such loan; and (3) pledge revenue and fund(s) resolution for repayment of any financing costs for constructing the Project; whereupon, the titles having been read and further readings waived, Resolution No. 23103 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Authorizing the City Manager to File a Financial Assistance Application for Financing Agreement with the State Water Resources Control Board for the Jackson Street Recycled Water Pipeline - Phases I and II Project; Resolution No. 23104 of the City Council of the City of Riverside, California, Authorizing the Advance of Funds for Expansion of the City of Riverside's Recycled Water System, Subject to Later Reimbursement of City Expenditures by the State Water
